Greetings to all,
I don't know about you, but I've got a bad case of spring fever, and with that comes the construction season.

The Town has a slate of projects scheduled. One that will impact all of us will be the highway water line replacement. This project will be replacing the old, wrapped steel line in two sections along Highway 143, beginning at the Public Works building and going north to approximately Georg's; then the second part beginning at Hunter Ridge Drive and going north to Aspen Drive. Brian Head Town is working with UDOT to see if we can detour traffic onto Aspen then to Spruce to speed up this section. Like I said, this will impact all of us.

Other projects include Rue Jolly water line replacement and the Snowshoe-Toboggan water and sewer line project. This is a high priority because of the fire protection it will bring to this area of town.

With all the construction and traffic this project will bring, **PLEASE be careful out there**, especially in the canyon. PLEASE just slow down and enjoy the view.

I am also very sad that our Public Works Director and my friend, Aldo Biasi will be leaving us. He will be heading up the Parowan City Public Works department. (I feel for those guys.)
