IT Specialist Braxton Minkey reported that he will be providing the Council with new android tablets. The iPads they are currently using are outdated and beyond their life span.



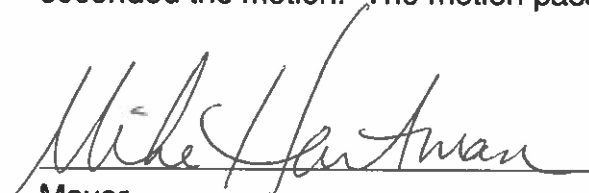
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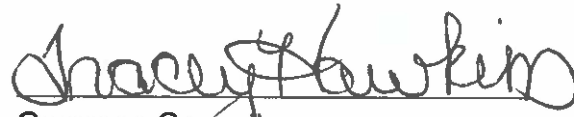
Clerk-Treasurer Angela Eck reminded the Council that their next meeting will include information about the proposed 2026 budget and that it is imperative that a quorum be present over the next several meetings. Mayor Mike Hartman presented the Council with information on a program called Community Cats & TNR. He met with Courtney Butler about this program and she will attend the September 2nd meeting. He also informed the Council that he and Clerk-Treasurer Eck did put money in the 2026 budget for this program. Ms. Butler estimates that Butler has 600 to 800 feral cats in town.

Code Enforcement Officer Stuart Mutzfeld reported that he also met with Ms. Butler and that the Council will need to pass a "Feral Cat" Ordinance in order to become part of the program.
