

The Common Council for the City of New Lisbon met in regular session on Monday, August 18, 2025, at 7:00 PM in the New Lisbon Community Room with the following members present: Mayor Mark Toelle, Alderpeople Marv Newlun, Sheldon LaBudda, Morgan Reichhoff, and Ken Southworth. Also present: City Administrator Angie Schultz and City Clerk/Treasurer Jen Pedersen. A motion was made by Newlun, second by Reichhoff, to approve the City of New Lisbon meeting minutes from July 21, 2025. With a voice vote, all members present voted "aye." Motion carried.

Ed Kailin, President of Castle Rock ATV Club, requested permission to proceed to legislation to amend WI SS 23.33(11)(am)4 to reflect the speed limit designation from 35 to 45 mph on state highways.

A motion by LaBudda, second by Southworth, was made to approve Resolution 0818-2025-01, dedicating land for highway purposes as part of the project for the reconstruction of Highway 80. With a voice vote, all members present voted "aye." Motion carried.

A motion by LaBudda, second by Reichhoff, was made to approve Ordinance 0721-25-01 to amend and repeal Chapter 520 of zoning amendments. With a voice vote, all members present voted "aye." Motion carried.

Contingent upon the City Attorney's review, LaBudda made a motion, second by Southworth, to approve an employment agreement with Nick Wyss for \$1,400/month, effective on August 1, 2025, to oversee compliance testing and paperwork for the Water and Sewer Department. He will be compensated at \$50.00/hour, with a two-hour minimum per on-call work. With a roll call vote, LaBudda, Newlun, Southworth, and Reichhoff voted "aye." Motion carried.

A motion by Reichhoff, second by Newlun, to approve hiring Britany Piccione as the Youth Services Coordinator/Assistant Librarian for the New Lisbon Memorial Library. With a voice vote, all members present voted "aye." Motion carried.

Three operator licenses were approved on a motion by Newlun, second by Reichhoff – Aubree Uteley and Kendra Daniels for Wagner Shell New Lisbon LLC and Robin Voltz for Tuesday's Bar & Grill. With a voice vote, all members present voted "aye" on all three applications. Motion carried.

City Administrator Angie Schultz has been meeting with employees, reading through the Employee Handbook/Ordinances, and researching zoning requests. City Clerk Jen Pedersen reported on upcoming training and meetings. Mayor Toelle has been monitoring the Director of Public Works' emails to answer questions and concerns. The PFC will be discussing the increase in the use of E-bikes and scooters, with a focus on ensuring safety. Officer Weber will be visiting several classrooms to speak with students about safe practices and awareness. Alderperson Southworth raised concerns about off-street parking. Alderperson Newlun updated on the first responders and fire department calls. Alderperson LaBudda suggested that the powerhouse roof will need to be patched soon.

A motion was made to approve \$31,872.27 in monthly invoices by Newlun, second by Reichhoff. With a roll call vote, LaBudda, Newlun, Southworth, and Reichhoff voted "aye." Motion carried.

At 7:50 PM, a motion was made by Newlun, second by LaBudda, to enter into closed session. With a voice vote, all members voted "aye." A motion to reconvene into open session was made by Newlun, second by Southworth, at 8:11 PM. Newlun made a motion, second by Southworth, to approve contracted services by Lisa Vinz for \$20/hour, less than 5 hours/month, not to exceed \$500 for the year. With a roll call vote, LaBudda, Newlun, Southworth, and Reichhoff voted "aye." Motion carried.

A motion by Newlun, second by Southworth, was made to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 PM.
