

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.356390 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of the City of Sandy Oaks.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.356390 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.345818 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.356390 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for the City of Sandy Oaks from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that the City of Sandy Oaks may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that the City of Sandy Oaks is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 10, 2026 AT 6:30 P.M. AT SANDY OAKS CITY HALL, 22870 PRIEST ROAD, SANDY OAKS, TEXAS 78112.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, the City of Sandy Oaks is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or in opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the City Council of the City of Sandy Oaks at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter–approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by the City of Sandy Oaks last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by the City of Sandy Oaks this year.

Total tax rate (per \$100 of value)	\$0.341800	\$0.356390	increase of 0.014590 per \$100, or 4.27%
Average homestead taxable value	\$131,478	\$133,076	increase of 1.22%
Tax on average homestead	\$449.39	\$474.27	increase of \$24.88, or 5.54%
Total tax levy on all properties	\$915,489	\$957,391	increase of \$41,902, or 4.58%
