

MINUTES TOM REPINO PARK COMMITTEE MEETING
FEBRUARY 3, 2026

1. Discussion continued on the Community Center Entrance Ramp. Mr. Crickmer suggested that the dark areas on the wooden surface were a result of salt intrusion from previous de-icing applications. Mr. Crickmer suggested a power washing of the surface might help remove ingrained salt, thus providing a better surface for refinishing and painting.

Mrs. Sarmiento suggested a resurfacing and painting of the entrance rail handrails was in order, as there are rough areas where people occasionally pick up splinters.

2. There was further discussion on the Tom Repino Park Entrance sign. Mr. Crickmer provided several example photos of various styles and configurations. Members were in favor of the curved design. Mr. Crickmer stated that he has begun his search for contractors, having made four inquiries so far.

3. Mr. Crickmer agreed to, and was made an administrator on the Sandy Oaks Community Center Facebook webpage.

4. Three Community Center volunteers (Garza, Rogers, Sarmiento) suggested there should be some sort of awning/protective cover installed above the main entrance to the Community Center in order to shield those entering and leaving the building from a deluge of water when it rains.

5. There was a discussion as to the status and function of the Ring Doorbell at the main entrance. Does it work? Who has access to the data that's collected?
