The City of Wisconsin Dells, Adams, Columbia, Juneau and Sauk Counties, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: PURPOSE

This ordinance amends current Sign Ordinance to allow for Pole Signs in C2 District. This would allow for new designs and technology and help with the visual aesthetics of the Downtown District.

SECTION II: CODE SECTION REVISED

Code Sec. 22.10(4) is amended.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS REVISED:

22.10 (4) C-2 Downtown Commercial Zoning District

(b) Permitted Signs

Permitted Signs. The following signs or other advertising structures are permitted: Directional signs; Marquee/Awning/Canopy Signs; Monument signs; **On Premise Pole signs**; Portable signs, Projecting and Blade signs; Temporary signs; Wall signs; and, Window signs. See Table (E) for restrictions on these permitted signs.

CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS
ORDINANCE NO. 919
(Sign – Pole/Monument** Signs)**

The City of Wisconsin Dells, Adams, Columbia, Juneau and Sauk Counties, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: PURPOSE

This ordinance clarifies the location requirements of Monument Signs.

SECTION II: CODE SECTION REVISED

Code Sec. 22.10(5) d (1) is amended.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS REVISED:

22.10 (5) C-1 Neighborhood Commercial, C-3 Highway Commercial, C-4 Large-scale Commercial and M-1 Mixed Use Zoning Districts.

(d) C-4 Large Scale Commercial – Details

(1) Pole/**Monument** Signs

- (a) Off-premises/**monument** pole signs shall be not less than 200 feet from any other pole or monument sign or sign structure on the same side of the street on which the pole sign or sign structure is situated.
- (b) Existing Sauk signs exempted: Off-premises pole signs in the C-4 Commercial Zoning District existing and documented in the 2013 Sauk County Sign inventory shall be exempt from the 200 ft. spacing requirement. These signs will remain regulated by the 100 ft. sign separation requirement in place when they were installed.
- (c) An on-premises pole/**monument** sign may be nearer than 200 feet to any other pole or monument sign if it is the only on-premises pole or monument sign situated upon the premises or parcel upon which the business or commercial activity is situated; and, if the business is located in a stand-alone building.

SECTION IV: VALIDITY

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION V: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication and as

provided by statute.

SECTION VII: PART OF CODE

This ordinance becomes a part of Wisconsin Dells Codes, Chapter 5.

CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS ORDINANCE NO. 920

Parking Revisions 2025

The City of Wisconsin Dells, Adams, Columbia, Juneau and Sauk Counties, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Purpose and Provisions Affected.

This ordinance amends and creates sections of the Parking Code per the recommendation and request of the Parking Manager. There are nine (9) provisions:

1. Abandoned vehicles. Sec. 10.22 (26) is created to deal with abandoned vehicles on public property.
2. Tampering/interference. Sec. 10.22 (27) is created to disallow interference with parking enforcement.
3. Oversized vehicles. Sec. 10.22 (29) is created to regulate oversized vehicle parking.
4. Water vessel trailers. Sec. 10.22(14) is repealed and recreated to regulate the parking of water vessels trailers.
5. Unattended trailers. Sec. 10.22 (15) is amended to reduce from forty-eight (48) hours to twenty-four (24) hours street parking of unattended trailers.
6. Overnight parking. Sec. 10.22 (17) is amended to designate overnight parking areas.
7. Parking permits. Sec 10.22 (28) is created to control the display and use of parking permits issued by the City.

8. Penalties for violations. Sec. 10.27 is renumbered to 10.22(99) and amended to connect the penalty section to the parking restrictions section and to provide penalties for the new and amended coded sections.
9. Metered parking. Sec. 10.22(7) is amended to authorize metered parking on streets and in parking areas with time limits established by common council resolution; with one vehicle per stall except up to three motorcycles with all subject to enforcement.

SECTION 2. Substantive Provisions.

See Exhibit A below. Numbered provisions 1-9. All in Code Sec. 10.22, Parking Regulations.

SECTION 3: Validity

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION 4: Conflicting Provisions Repealed

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: Effective Date

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication and as provided by statute.

SECTION 6: Part Of Code

This ordinance becomes a part of Wisconsin Dells Code, Chapter 10.

EXHIBIT 'A' **to Parking Revisions 2025 Ordinance**

(26) Abandoned Vehicle

- a) Definition – “Abandoned Vehicle” in this section means an operable and licensed vehicle left unattended on public property for more than seventy-two (72) hours and will be considered a public nuisance.
- b) No person may abandon a vehicle in any metered stall or municipal parking lot for more than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours. In a snow removal emergency vehicles must be removed within 24 hours following the cessation of the emergency snow removal declaration.
- c) No person may abandon a vehicle on any street during the months of the alternate side parking restriction; (i.e. between December 1 and March 31 of each calendar year).

d) It is a violation of this section if the vehicle is not moved within seventy-two (72) hours. The city may order vehicles in violation of this section to be moved/towed and stored and the owner will pay the reasonable cost of such moving/towing and storage.

(27) Tampering/Interference.

No person may interfere or tamper with parking enforcement tools, such as citations or warnings, or procedures, such as the marking or chalking of tires including, without limitation, removal or transfer of citations issued by authorized city officers or staff.

(29) Oversized Vehicles.

- a) Definition – school bus is defined at Wis. Stat 340.01(56). Motor bus is defined at Wis. Stat 340.01(31). Recreational vehicle (RV) is defined at Wis. Stat. 340.01(48r). Oversized vehicle is defined at Trans 250.02(e) & 250.02(f).
- b) Bus, RV and oversized vehicles may park on all non-metered streets not to exceed twenty-four (24) hours. Bus, RV and oversized vehicles may park on all metered streets and municipal parking lots and must pay all parking fees for each stall occupied; except as provided in secs. 10.22(1) and 10.22(12)(b).
- c) Except as provided in 10.22(12), 10.22(14) and 10.22(15), vehicles with trailers may park on all non-metered streets. Vehicles with trailers may park all metered streets and municipal parking lots and shall pay for parking fees for each stall occupied.

(14) Water Craft Trailers

- a) Definition – A Water Craft Trailer is defined as a vehicle without any mode of power that is required to be, or is capable of being pulled, towed or drawn by another vehicle and which is designed or used for carrying, hauling or transporting power boats, sailboats, waver runners, jet skis or any other type of vehicle used in or on the water.
- b) The Municipal Boat Launch Lot is reserved for vehicles with water craft trailers only.
- c) Vehicles with water craft trailers may park on all non-metered streets where parking is not restricted, not to exceed twenty-four (24) hours. Vehicles with water craft trailers may park on all metered streets and municipal parking lots and shall pay applicable parking fees for each stall occupied.

(15) Unattended Trailers

- a) Definition. In this section, a “trailer” means vehicle without motive power designed for carrying property or passengers wholly on its own structure and for being drawn by a motor vehicle, but does not include a mobile home.
- b) No trailer, whether attached or unattached to a motor vehicle, may be parked on any street for more than twenty-four (24) consecutive hours unless authorized by the Chief of Police.

(17) Overnight Parking.

- a) Parking Lots – Overnight Parking is allowed in Municipal Parking Lots 1 – 8, but not to exceed twenty-four (24) consecutive hours, except as provided at Code Sec. 10.22(1).
- b) Street Parking – Except as provided in code sec. 10.22(1), overnight parking is allowed on all streets without restrictions.

- (28) Parking Permit.** Parking permits issued must be attached to the vehicle windshield on the driver’s side lower corner and must be attached by its own adhesive. Parking permits are issued to a specific vehicle identification number and registration plate and may not be used on any other vehicle. Fraudulent use of a parking permit may result in fines, forfeiture of the permit, and ineligibility for future parking permits.

(99) Penalties.

- a) The default penalty provisions of code sec. 10.22(99) will apply to violations of this section. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance will, upon conviction thereof, forfeit the amount set forth in the Uniform State Traffic Deposit Schedule adopted pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 345.26(2)(a); which is herewith adopted by reference, except that the following specific penalties will apply for the violations set forth below:

b) Cost of Prosecution. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this section shall, in addition to the forfeiture required, pay the costs of prosecution.

c) Failure to Pay Forfeiture. Any person who fails to pay any forfeiture or costs of prosecution as set forth in this section may be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but will not be imprisoned for more than ninety (90) days.

d) Traffic Violation and Registration Program. Any parking violation falling within the authority contained in the Wisconsin Administration Code, Chapter TRANS-128, will be subject to all actual costs by the City in connection with the State of Wisconsin's traffic violation and registration program.

e) Bond Schedule. In addition to the Uniform State Traffic Deposit Schedule referenced in Section 10.11(1), and the bond schedule set forth above, the Chief of Police may establish a bond schedule for all matters not otherwise controlled by applicable State law. This bond schedule and its future amendments will be made by a resolution approved by a majority of the City Council.

(7) Metered Parking.

a) The City may establish by Common Council resolutions time limits for the parking of vehicles on public streets and parking areas and may install and use parking meters and other devices to measure and enforce such time limits.

b) Only one (1) vehicle may occupancy and use a designated and regulated parking space, except up to three (3) motorcycles may be parked in a space and all will be subject to time limit enforcement.

Ald. Freel seconded the motion. Upon roll call vote the motion carried 6-0. Second reading is scheduled for April 22, 2025.
