CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS

October 20, 2025

Mayor Wojnicz called the meeting to order at 6:30PM. Notice of the meeting was provided to the *Dells Events*, WNNO Radio, and posted in accordance with State Statutes.

3. Motion by Ald. Holzem seconded by Ald. Ryan to approve the following consent agenda items: a. October 15, 2025 Common Council meeting minutes; b. Schedule of Bills Payable. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Motion by Ald. Anchor seconded by Ald. Anderson to approve an application for Special Event Permit submitted by Dells Downtown Event Management/BID for Downtown Wisconsin Dells Holiday Celebration/Elf on the Shelf for the Dates of November 21 through January 5, 2026 from 4:30 pm – 11:00 pm nightly. Motion carried unanimously.

2. The applicant obtains and remains current with a State of Wisconsin DATCP Tourist Rooming House license and the City of Wisconsin Dells Overnight Lodging License.
3. The overnight rental of the house will be subject to PRT, BID assessment, personal property & room tax, as well as commercial garbage, snow removal (if applicable) and electric rates. The applicant is responsible for providing clear accounting of the rental of this property upon request.
4. Any nuisances are addressed to the satisfaction of the City, including but not limited to noise, maintenance, and parking. Failure to address nuisances to the City's satisfaction can cause this permit to be revoked.
5. Applicant secures ownership of the property.
6. Applicant abides by the following restrictions:
 - a. Owner provides current, local, primary contact information to the Police Department and Zoning Office.
 - b. Renters sign an agreement not to cause excessive noise, not to trespass on neighboring property, and not to cause any other nuisance.
 - c. This permit is non-transferrable; any new owner or operator of the property will have to obtain a new Overnight Lodging Conditional Use Permit.
 - d. On-site parking is available and is required to be used by occupants. No on-street parking is permitted. Recommended maximum occupancy is 18 persons.

Ald. Anchor seconded the motion. Upon roll call vote the motion carried 6-0. Resolution adopted.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS AMENDED:

16.35 OVERNIGHT LODGING – TOURIST ROOMING HOUSES & SHORT TERM RENTALS

(10) Standards for TRHs & STRs

(e) Shall have functional smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors in accordance with the requirements of Wis. Admin. Code Chap SPS ~~362~~ **321.09**

CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS
ORDINANCE NO. 933
(Creates Columbia County Ward 10)

The Common Council, City of Wisconsin Dells, Adams, Columbia, Juneau and Sauk Counties, Wisconsin, ordains as follows:

SECTION I: Purpose.

The purpose of this ordinance is to create Ward 10 in Columbia County due to an annexation. The property is contiguous with Ward 2 but is a different County Supervisory District so a new ward has to be created.

SECTION II: PROVISIONS RENUMBERED AND CREATED

Wisconsin Dells Code sec. 2.02(10) is renumbered to 2.02(11)
Wisconsin Dells Code sec. 2.02(10) is created.

SECTION III: PROVISIONS AS CREATED

Wisconsin Dells Code sec. 2.02(10) is created as follows:

2.02 WARDS AND COMMON COUNCIL DISTRICTS

(10) Tenth Ward. The Tenth Ward shall consist of that part of the city located in Columbia County in Congressional District #6, Senate District #14, Assembly District 41 and County Supervisory District #2. Commencing at the Northeast corner of the NE1/4 of section 3; thence South along the East Line of said NE ¼-NW ¼, 120 feet to the point of beginning of this description;

Thence South along said East line of the NE ¼ - NW ¼, 440 feet to the center line of the River Road (formerly State Highway "13"); Thence N44°00'W, along the centerline of said River Road, 188.1 feet; thence N20°00'W, along the centerline of said River Road, 307.4 feet; Thence N86°24'E, 237 feet to the point of the beginning; containing 1.47 acres, more or less.

(11) The Common Council Districts shall consist of the following wards:

District One – Wards 1, 7 and 8

District Two – Wards 2, 4, 5 and 10

District Three – Wards 3, 6 and 9

SECTION IV: VALIDITY

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION V: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication and as provided by statute.

Holzem introduced the second reading of the ordinance for adoption. Motion was seconded by Ald. Ryan. Upon roll call vote the motion carried 6-0. Ordinance adopted and in full force after publication.

**CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS
ORDINANCE NO. 934
(Municipal Utilities)**

The City of Wisconsin Dells, Adams, Columbia, Juneau and Sauk Counties, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: PURPOSE.

The purpose of this ordinance is to update the sewer utility rates.

SECTION II: PROVISION AMENDED:

Wisconsin Dells Code sec. 7.04(11)(d) amended.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS AMENDED:

Wisconsin Dells Code sec. 7.04(11)(d) is amended as follows:

7.04 SEWERAGE UTILITY, USE AND CHARGES

(11) Sewer Service Charges

(d) Sewer Service Charges. A sewer service charge is hereby imposed upon each lot, parcel of land, building, or premises served by the public sewer and wastewater facilities or otherwise discharging sewage, including industrial wastes, into the public sewerage system. Such sewer service charge shall be payable as hereinafter provided and in amount calculated as follows:

1. CATEGORY A is normal or domestic strength wastewater having organic concentration of biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5) less than 200 milligrams per liter (mg/l) and suspended solids (SS) less than 250 milligrams per liter (mg/l). The sewer service charge for Category A wastewater is as follows:

a. The customer sewer service charge, with one customer on each meter, shall be ~~\$8.00~~ **\$8.80** per month.

b. The total volumetric charge shall be ~~\$7.56~~ **\$8.32** per 1000 gallons of total water used during the billing period.

c. The volumetric charge includes the following:

~~\$4.49~~ **\$6.29** is for operation and maintenance

~~\$0.93~~ **\$0.15** is for replacement costs

~~\$2.14~~ **\$1.88** is for debt retirement costs

2. CATEGORY B is wastewater having organic concentrations of biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5) greater than 200 milligrams per liter (mg/l) and/or suspended solids (SS) greater than 250 milligrams per liter (mg/l). The sewer service charge for Category B wastewater is as follows:

a. The customer sewer service charge, with one customer on each meter, shall be ~~\$8.00~~ **\$8.80** per month.

b. The total volumetric charge shall be equal to the volumetric charge for Category A wastewater, plus a High Strength Surcharge. The High Strength Surcharge shall be computed as the pounds of BOD5 discharged during the billing period which is in excess of domestic strength wastewater times a BOD5 unit price of ~~\$0.64~~ **\$0.70** per pound, plus the pounds of SS discharged during the billing period which is in excess of domestic strength wastewater times a SS unit price of ~~\$0.12~~ **\$0.13** per pound.

3. CATEGORY C is septage which has organic concentrations of biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5) greater than 200 milligrams per liter (mg/l) and/or suspended solids (SS) greater than 250 milligrams per liter (mg/l). The sewer service charge for Category C is as follows:

a. The total volumetric charge shall be equal to the volumetric charge for Category A wastewater, plus a Septage Surcharge. The Septage Surcharge shall be computed in the same manner as the High Strength Surcharge for Category B wastewater, with the exception that it will be assumed that holding tank wastewater has a BOD of 600 mg/l and SS of 1800 mg/l, and septic tank wastewater has a BOD of 7000 mg/l and SS of 15,000 mg/l.

b. Based on the above, the total volumetric charge for holding tank wastes shall be ~~\$7.56~~ **\$8.32** per 1000 gallons, and the total volumetric charge for septic tank wastes shall be ~~\$54.37~~ **\$59.81** per 1000 gallons. In addition to the volumetric charge, a handling fee of ~~\$17.37~~ **\$19.11** per load shall be charged to all septage (holding tank or septic tank wastes) discharged to the collection system.

SECTION IV: VALIDITY

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION V: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication and as provided by statute.

Ald. Holzem seconded the motion. Upon roll call vote the motion carried 6-0. Second reading is scheduled for November 17, 2025.

**CITY OF WISCONSIN DELLS
ORDINANCE NO. 935
(Munir & Taylor Frank Annexation)**

The City of Wisconsin Dells, Columbia, Sauk, Adams and Juneau Counties, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: TERRITORY ANNEXED BY DIRECT ANNEXATION

Pursuant to Wis. State Statute Sec. 66.0217(2) and the Petition for Direct Annexation by Unanimous Consent filed with the City Clerk by property owners Munir & Taylor Frank, parcel 11028.51.A in the Town of Newport, Columbia County, Wisconsin is hereby annexed in to the City of Wisconsin Dells, Wisconsin and the zoning map as set forth in section 19.612 of the Wisconsin Dells Municipal Code is hereby permanently amended to include the property set forth below. Total Acreage of said property is 1.47 acres. Population is 0. Annexation boundary map is attached as Exhibit A. Legal description is attached as Exhibit B. Upon annexation, said property will become part of City of Wisconsin Dells in Ward 10.

SECTION 2: EFFECT OF ANNEXATION

From and after the effective date of this ordinance, the territory described in Section 1 will be a part of the City of Wisconsin Dells for any and all purposes provided by law, and all persons residing within such territory shall be subject to all ordinances, rules and regulations governing the City of Wisconsin Dells.

SECTION 3: TEMPORARY ZONING CLASSIFICATION

The territory annexed to the City of Wisconsin will be zoned R-1 Residential.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance will be in force from and after its introduction and publication as provided by statute.

Holzem introduced the second reading of the ordinance for adoption. Motion was seconded by Ald. Ryan. Upon roll call vote the motion carried 6-0. Ordinance adopted and in full force after publication.
