### Town Council Meeting

#### Opening of Meeting:

The meeting was held at Fortville Town Hall, 714 E. Broadway. Meeting was called to order by Council President Tonya Davis at 6:30 pm.

#### Present:

Tonya Davis, President; Ryan Rummell, Vice President (via Zoom); Libby Wyatt, Council Member; Fritz Fentz, Council Member; Joe Renner, Town Manager; Alex Intermill, Town Attorney; Missy Glazier, Clerk Treasurer.

#### Not Present:

#### Approval of Agenda:

Ryan Rummell made a motion to approve the agenda for today September 2nd, 2025; Libby Wyatt second the motion. Motion carried, passed 4/0.

#### Approval of Minutes

Ryan Rummell made a motion to approve the minutes for the August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Town Council Meeting. Libby Wyatt second the motion. Motion carried, passed 4/0.

#### Old Business:

- a) The council will consider the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2025-8D, a request for a Rezone of one (1) acre from Residential 3.5 to Community Commercial at the northeast corner of Broadway & Ohio Street. The following questions were asked before final decision could be determined.
  - i. According to the Indiana Code, the question of whether the proposed rezoning would be consistent with the adopted Town of Fortville 10-year Comprehensive Plan Map for 2034 that showed these parcels as suitable for commercial suburban land uses.
  - ii. Secondly, are the reasons for rezoning consistent with the current conditions or character of current structures on the property.
  - iii. Third, are they consistent with the most desirable use of the land, considering the four lots have been vacant since the platting in 1953.

- iv. Fourth, are the reasons for rezoning consistent with the conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction. No evidence suggests that property values would be negatively impacted.
- v. Additionally, buffer yards and setbacks will need to be provided. On the east, they'd have to provide a 25ft buffer yard, which is a type three, the restrictive buffer yard. They would have to have shrubs, trees, a fence, a mound, and a 15ft setback.
- vi. Finally, will the rezoning be consistent with responsible growth and development. The highly traveled intersection is suitable for commercial development, buffer yards, and setbacks will need to be provided per the zoning ordinance to protect the residential areas nearby.

Ryan Rummell made a motion to approve Ordinance 2025-8D, a request for a Rezone of one (1) acre from Residential 3.5 to Community Commercial at the northeast corner of Broadway & Ohio Street with added restrictions on use of land for a gas station. Town Council and BZA Planning Commission will need to re-evaluate use when/if such use is requested. Libby Wyatt second motion, passed 4/0.

### **New Business:**

- a) Council will hear promotion announcements within the Fortville Police Department, presented by PD Chief Patrick Bratton.
  - i. **Officer D. Pruitt:** He is being promoted to Sargent. In 2024, he became a state certified academy instructor and currently holds specialties in emergency vehicle operations, will be certified as a state firearms instructor this fall, he is currently an EMT, he has been trained as a SWAT support member. Congratulations!
  - ii. **Officer D. Graffitti:** She is being promoted to Sargent. She is a founding member of the Hancock County Child Advocacy Team. She is a child first forensic interviewer. She handles all of our sex crimes, our juvenile crimes. She is very patient and compassionate while handling these types of crimes and investigations.
  - iii. **Sargent D. Archer.** He is being promoted to Lieutenant. He is certified academy instructor, currently holds specialties in physical tactics, ground combat, STOPS instructor, standardized field sobriety, drug recognition expert, completed the police executive leadership academy (PELLA) He is a certified K9 handler and supervises A shift with his K9 partner, Oscar.
  
- b) Council President will appoint Sean Simmons to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

- c) Council will reappoint Libby Wyatt to the Economic Development Commission.

Tanya Davis made a motion to reappoint Libby Wyatt to the Economic Development Commission. Fritz Fentz second the motion. Motion carried, passed 3/0

- d) Council President will reappoint Robert Holland to the Economic Development Commission.
- e) Ryan Rummell made a motion to recess the regular town council meeting at 6:53 pm and open the Public Hearing to discuss the Landmark Park build-operate-transfer (B.O.T) proposal.

Joe Renner: We advertised for RFP's for the contractors to do the B.O.T for the parks and came up with seven or nine different individuals who requested information. However, only Reynolds Construction submitted a bid for this particular project. Committee recommended working with Reynolds since we have worked with them before and feel confident the job will be done well. This topic was opened to the public for comment. None was given.

Ryan Rummell made a motion to close the public hearing and resume the town council meeting at 6:56 pm. Fritz Fentz second the motion. Motion carried, passed 4/0.

- i) Council will consider Resolution No. 2025-9A, awarding the Landmark BOT project to Reynolds Construction.

Ryan Rummell made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2025-9A awarding the Landmark Park BOT project. Libby Wyatt second motion. Motion carried, passed 4/0.

- j) Council will hear a presentation from VS Engineering regarding the regional lift station and associated contract.

Lou Savka of VS Engineering: A handout has been distributed to council for consideration. The area around the school campus on the south side of town has seen some major growth. There are two lift stations that currently service that area. With all the developments in Mt. Vernon North and Buyer Estates coming in, we are going to overload the system very shortly. A new regional lift station will need to be built. Details and conversation were held by council. (presentation attached)

- k) Council will review and consider bids for two service trucks for the Street & Utilities Department. Joe Renner: We received 6 separate quotes for each vehicle: Street Rigger Pickup and the Utility truck. O'Brian's quote for the Pickup came in the lowest at \$66,346 and with Tom Wood for the Utility Truck in the amount of \$76,796.25

Ryan Rummell made a motion to approve the O'Brian quote of \$66,346 and the Tom Wood quote of \$76,796.25 to purchase the two vehicles for the Street and Utilities Department. Libby Wyatt second the motion. Motion carried, passed 4/.

### **Department Head Reports:**

#### **Town Manager: Joe Renner**

We did just lose another one of our Street Utility workers. He was a good worker but he left for another company that offered a substantial increase in pay. Focusing on working with the salary ordinance is very important going forward. We need to think about the need to replace the institutional knowledge that we have retiring in the next 5 years. We will not have anyone that knows all the placement of underground utilities, how to repair issues and what needs to be done.

The community crossing paving in the Timber Ridge subdivision has been completed. There is a little more sidewalk work to be done, but they will finish it all up on Thursday of this week. They started today on the work included in the change order signed during the last council meeting.

#### **Planning & Building Director: Adam Zaklikowski**

#### **Parks Manager: Heath Luther**

The basketball hoops are out of powder coating. They will be taking down the old ones and the new ones will be put up on Friday. Backboards will be put up next week. He wanted to give a shout out to the Kammie's Kause crew on their event. They left the parks in great shape.

#### **Police Chief: Chief Patrick Bratton**

On Saturday evening a vehicle drove through the pylons down by the Wine Garage and onto the patio. It was determined that the gentleman had a Dora cup which he was going out to his car to refill and walk around. This is not the intended use for these cups and goes against the rules. He was arrested leaving the scene of the accident. The street department are replacing the damaged pylons right away.

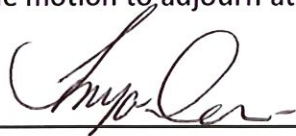

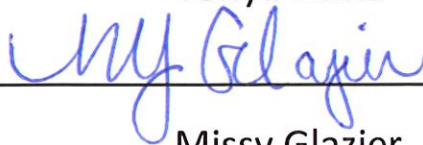

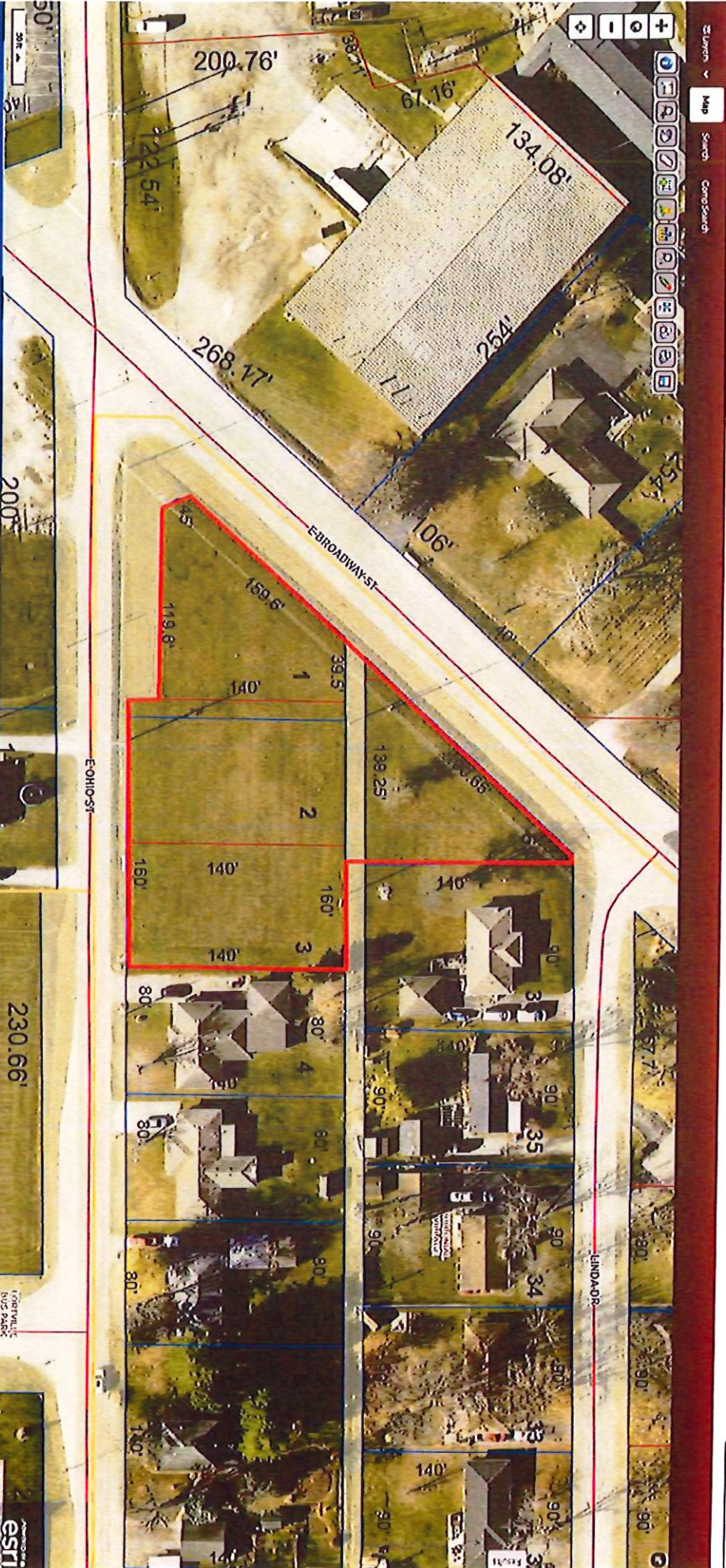
# NEC Broadway & Ohio Rezone

- Location: Northeast corner of Broadway & Ohio Street.
- Owner: MAC and Mike, LLC (c/o Michael Crouse, Sr. and Mike Thompson)
- Petitioner: Mike Thompson
- Zoning: Residential: 3.5 (R3.5); Seeking Rezone to Commercial: Community (CC).
- Property Use: Vacant; Empty grassy lots
- Size: About 1 acre.
- Request / Background:
  - ◆ The property consists of 4 undeveloped residential lots in the Colonial Village platted subdivision (Lots 1, 2, 3, 65).
  - ◆ The owners would like to sell the property and believe that allowing for a commercial use on the property would be the highest and best use for the property.
  - ◆ There are no commercial buyers that have committed to purchase of the property at this time.

# Aerial Photo (2023) / Parcel Map

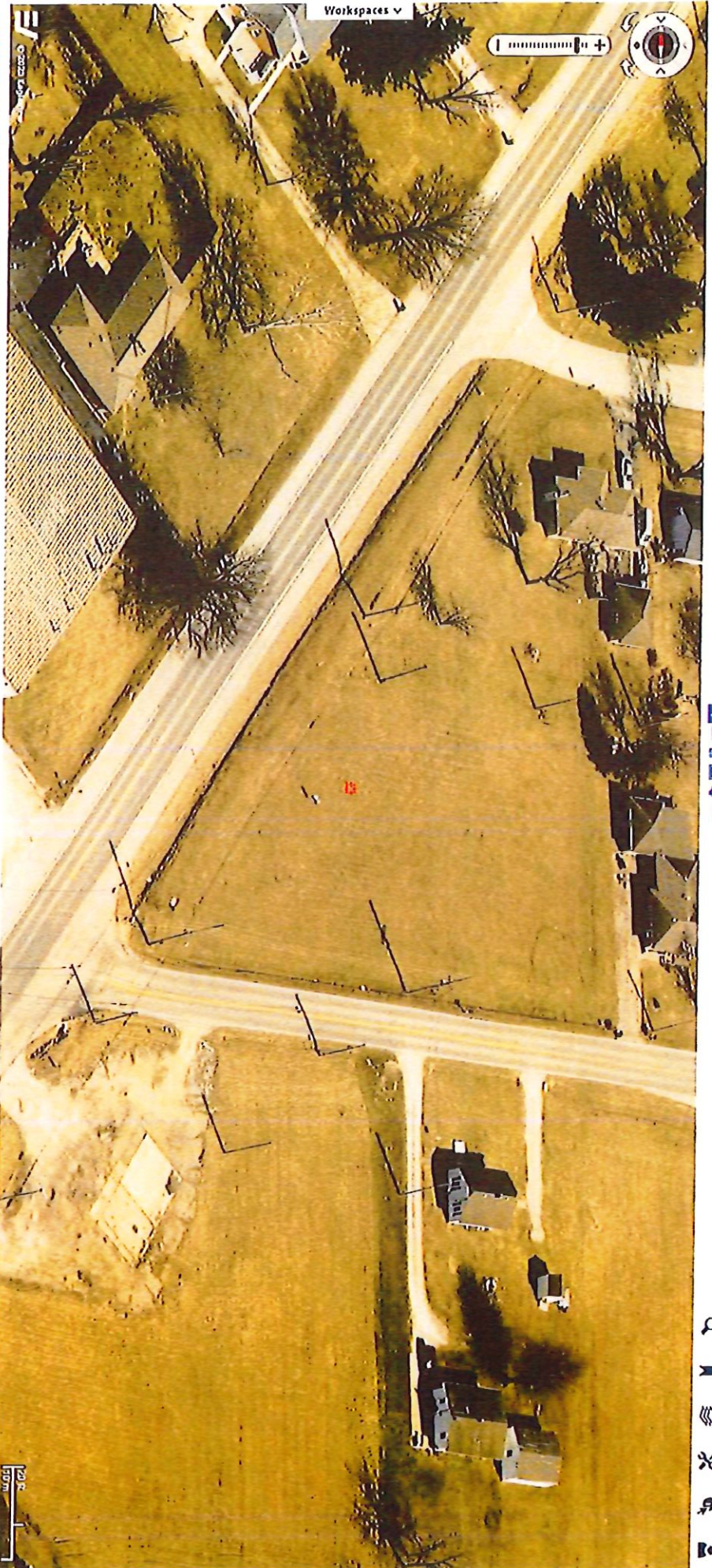

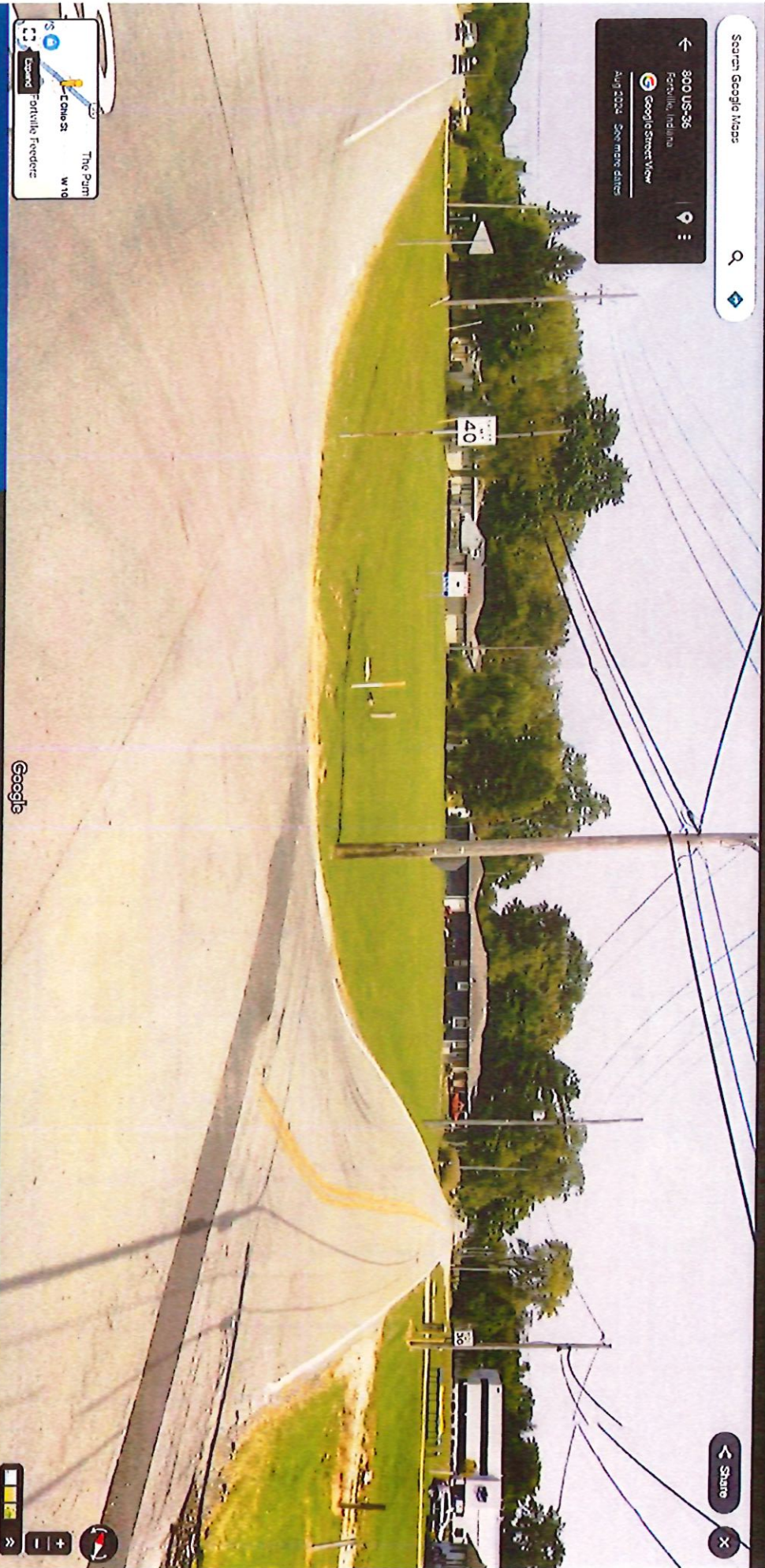

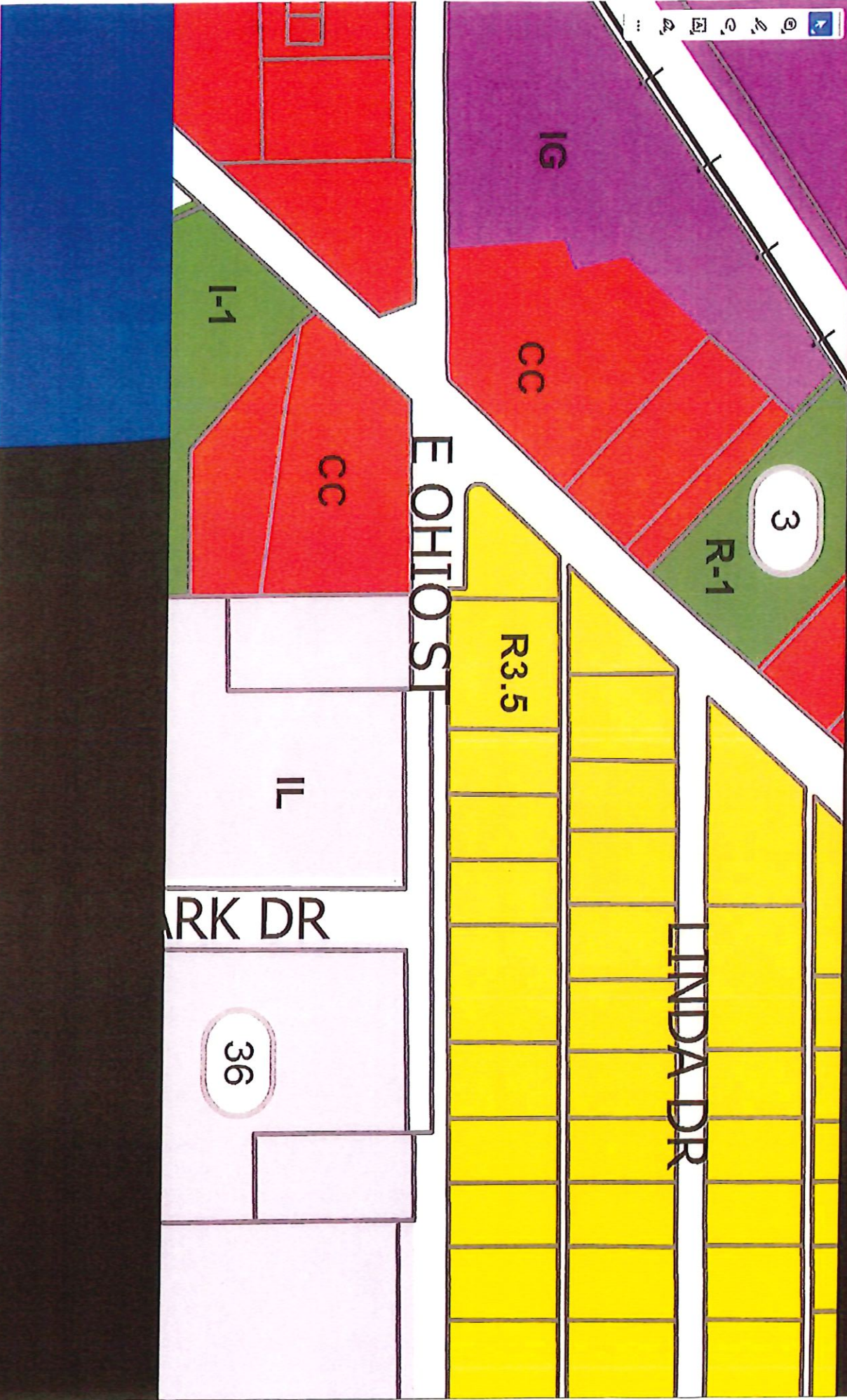

# Zoning Map - Current

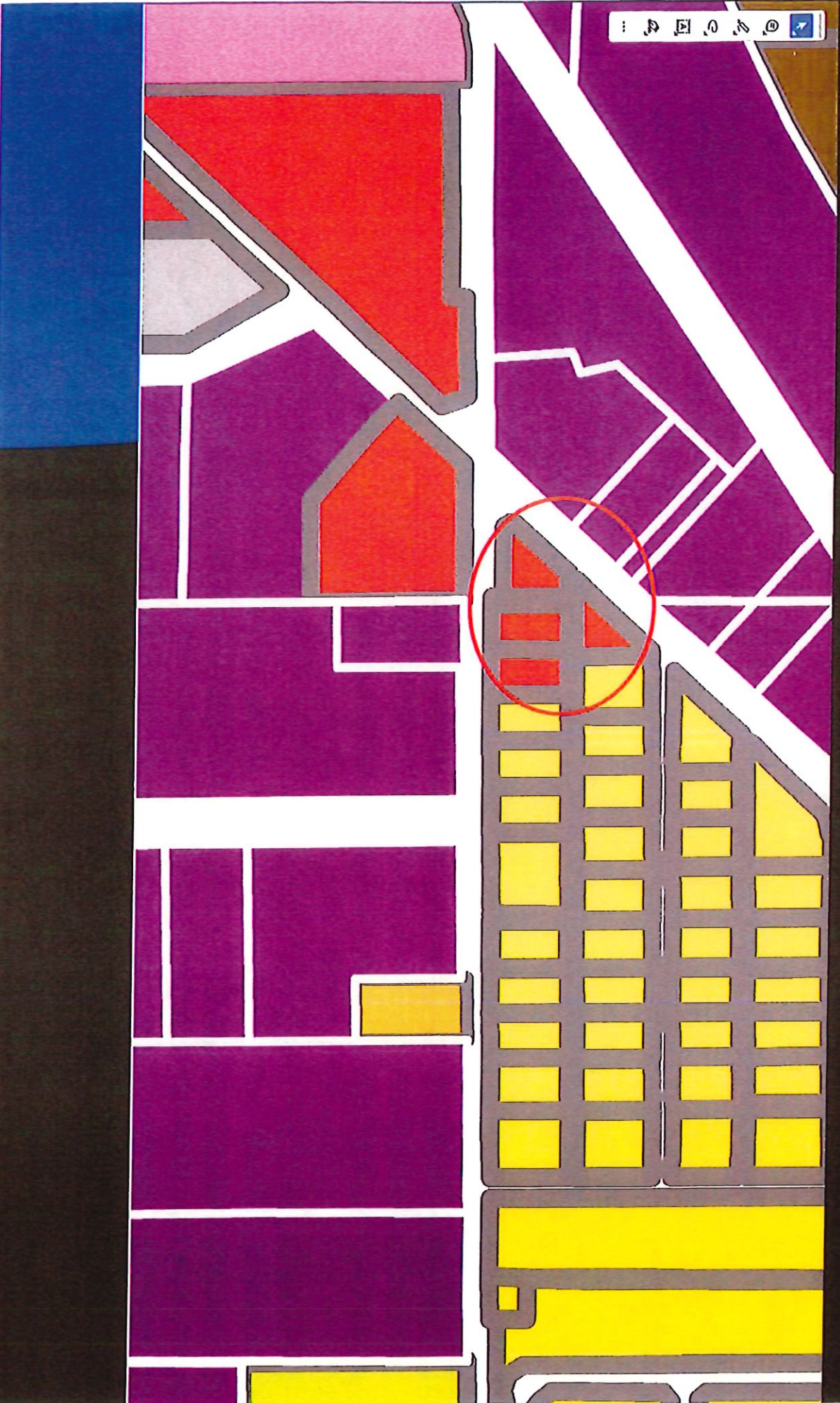


# NEC Broadway & Ohio Rezone

Evaluation Criteria for Rezones per Indiana Code:

- 1) Consistent with the Comprehensive Plan?
  - ◆ Yes. The adopted Town of Fortville 10-Year Comprehensive Plan Map (2034) (As Amended January 2025) designates these 4 parcels as suitable for “Commercial – Suburban” land uses. The zoning district of Commercial: Community (CC) aligns with this intended land use.

Evaluation Criteria for Rezones per Indiana Code:

- 2) Consistent with current conditions/character of current structures?
  - ◆ Not applicable. There are no current structures on the parcels.

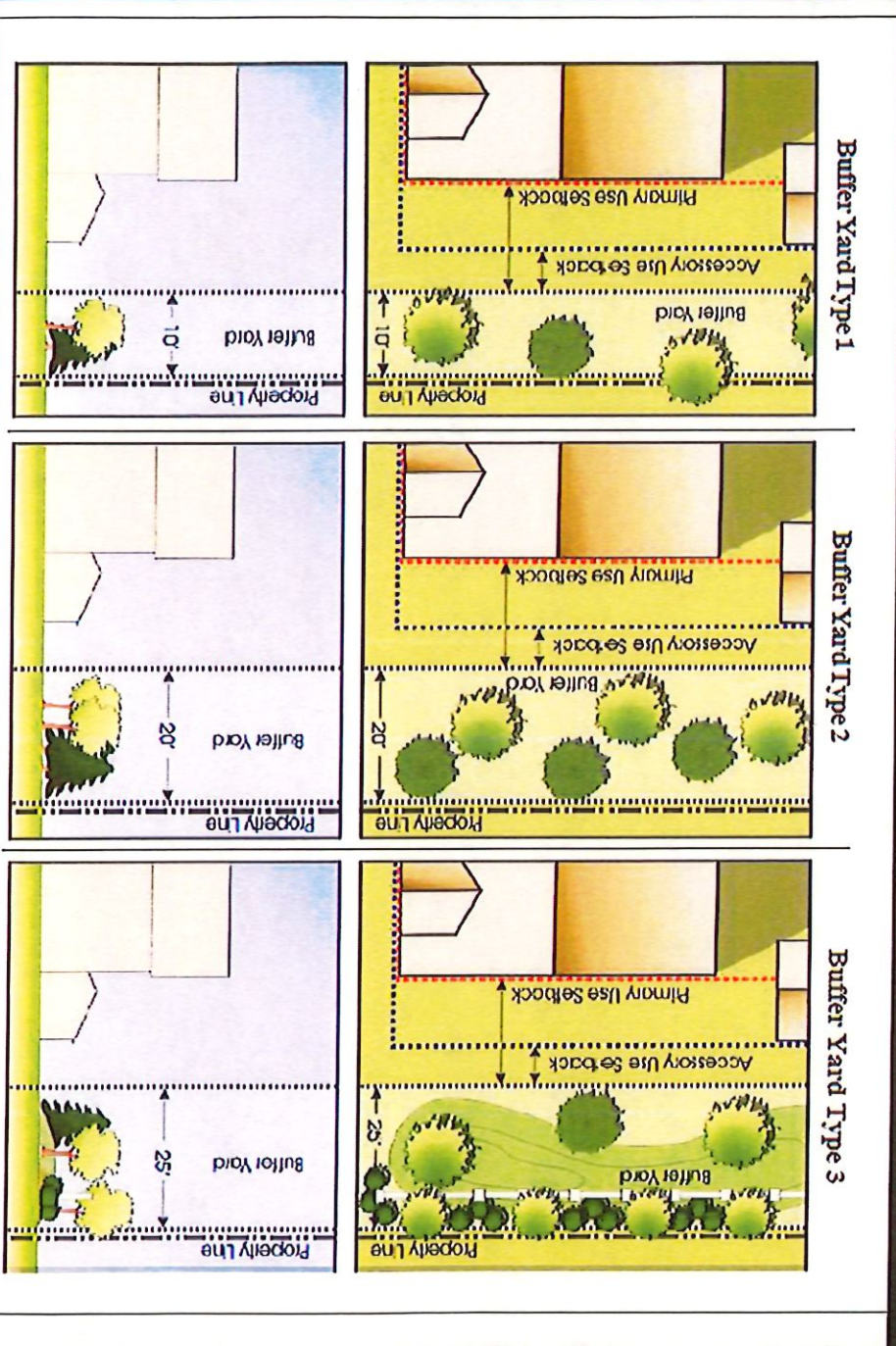
# NEC Broadway & Ohio Rezone

Evaluation Criteria for Rezones per Indiana Code:

- 3) Consistent with most desirable use of land?
  - ◆ Yes. *These 4 lots have been vacant lots since their platting in 1953. The adopted Comprehensive Plan map sets forth the most desirable uses of land and it is consistent with that commercial designation.*

# Evaluation Criteria for Rezones per Indiana Code:

- **4) Consistent with conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction?**
  - ◆ Yes. *There is no evidence to suggest that property values would be negatively impacted. Additionally, buffer yards and setbacks will need to be provided.*
    - ★ East: 25' buffer yard (Type 3) + 15' setback.



# NEC Broadway & Ohio Rezone

- 5) Consistent with responsible growth and development?
  - ★ Yes. The highly-traveled intersection is suitable for commercial development. Buffer yards and setbacks will need to be provided per the Zoning Ordinance to protect the residential areas nearby.

# Town Council Comments

- 1<sup>st</sup> Reading (introductory reading) of the Rezone ordinance occurred on August 18, 2025.
- Some Council members seemed supportive; Others were concerned about proximity to residential areas nearby (and wanted to ensure proper buffering); Some were concerned about a possible gas station.
  - ◆ A gas station has not been proposed; If proposed in the future, a Special Exception is required from the Board of Zoning Appeals subject to a public hearing.

# Community Response

- All public hearing requirements have been met (sign posting, mailing to nearby property owners, newspaper publication in Greenfield Reporter).
- Some Fortville residents have expressed concern about a potential future gas station use and commercial uses near a residential area.
- 1 letter of remonstrance received.

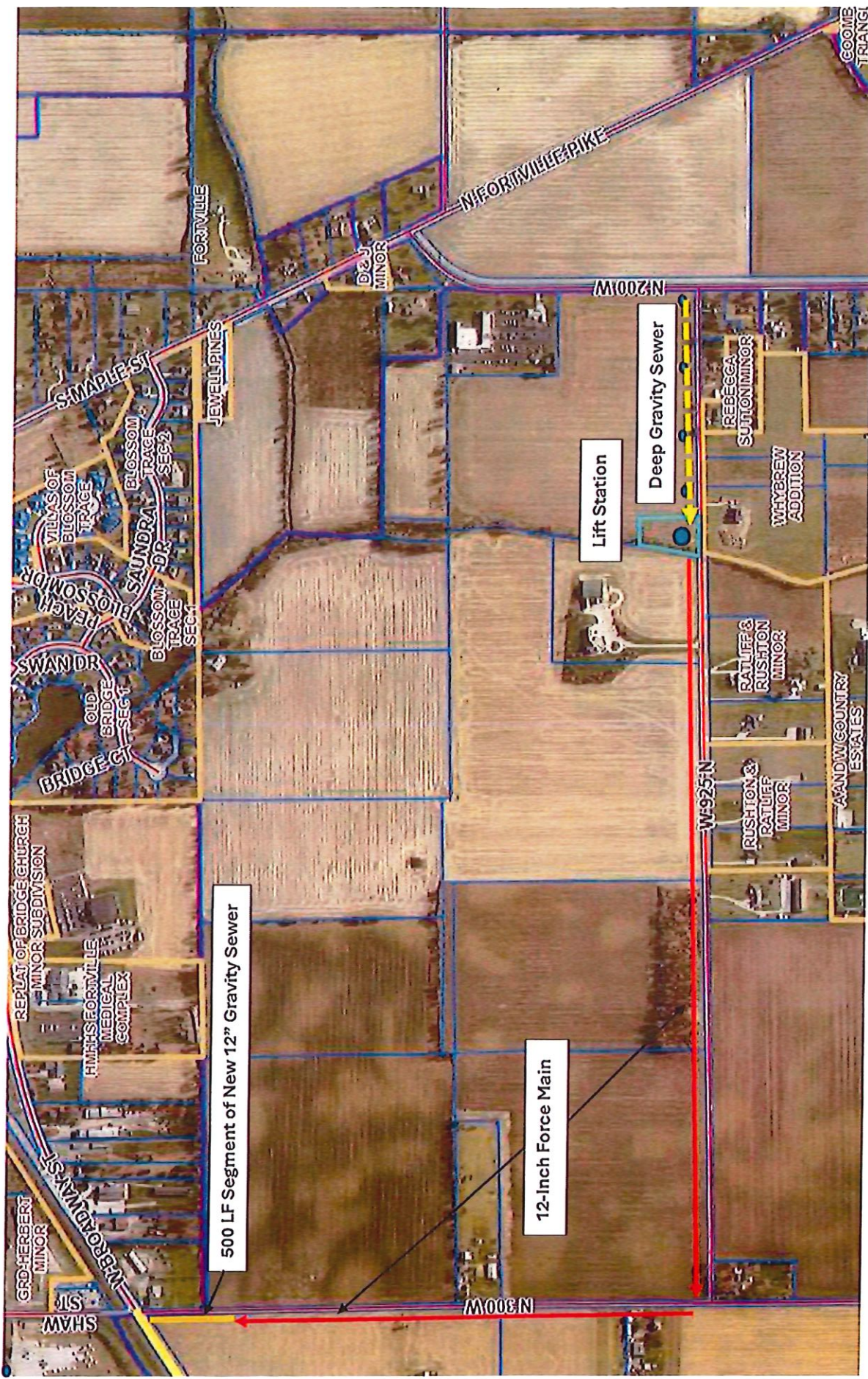

# NEC Broadway & Ohio Rezone

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Plan Commission grant a Favorable Recommendation to the Town Council of the Rezone.

Note, if desired by the Plan Commission (or Council) to prevent a gas station:

- 1) Could require a Zoning Commitment from the petitioner to restrict out a gas station use that would run with the land. Lifting this Commitment would require a review by the Plan Commission and Council approval, in addition to the Special Exception from the BZA.
