CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Jared Hillier called the Regular City Council Meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

- B. New Parade Signage Requirements-Action Item: Mayor Hillier updated the council regarding his meeting with the school. The school is not able to absorb some of the costs of the signs for parade routes, so the costs of the new signs will be shared by the City and Hagerman Valley Chamber of Commerce. Wes Owsley suggested implementing a parade route fee to recoup some of the costs for the signs. Justin Hulme provided a quote from a company for the required signs. Nick Hainline made a motion to approve the purchase of the new signage for parade routes in the amount of \$4,139.42. The motion was seconded by Erika Cornett. A roll call vote was held.
