1. Calling the Meeting to Order:

3. Notice of Meeting – Nassau Herald:

The Village Clerk reported that notice of the public meeting was emailed to the Nassau Herald, posted on the bulletin board outside of Village Hall and in the lobby of Village Hall and posted on the Village website.

4. Minutes- Minutes of the Meeting on January 13, 2026

On motion by Deputy Mayor Zylberberg, seconded by Mayor Oliviero, and approved unanimously, the Board dispensed with the reading of the January 13, 2026 minutes as the Clerk had previously mailed such minutes and they are hereby approved.

5. Pot Hole Repairs

On motion by Deputy Mayor Zylberberg, seconded by Trustee Davidov and unanimously carried, the Board approved the proposal received from Roadwork Ahead, Inc dated March 9, 2026 to repair a pothole at the entrance of Hewlett Hight School at the Everit Avenue gates at a price not to exceed \$7560.

6. Proposed Road Program on Meadowview between Cedar and E Broadway

WHEREAS, after the February 23, 2026 blizzard, Meadowview Avenue from the Village boundary at East Broadway to Piermont Avenue became damaged and unrepairable using a patch or similar repair option on account of the damage to the road base, and

WHEREAS, the blizzard and the resulting damage to the road base was unexpected and unanticipated, and

WHEREAS, the roadway condition impacts safety of motorists and pedestrians, and

WHEREAS, the repair of the roadway cannot wait for public bidding in accordance with the General Municipal Law, and

WHEREAS, the Village has solicited proposals for the work to provide for the work to be obtained at the lowest cost possible,

NOW, THEREFORE, On motion by Mayor Oliviero, seconded by Trustee Davidov and unanimously carried, due to the emergency condition and the impact to public safety, an emergency repair is required, and the Board, having obtained proposals for the work, approves the proposal received from Roadwork Ahead, Inc. dated March 9, 2026 to mill, pave a replace road base where needed from the Village boundary at East Broadway on Meadowview Avenue to Piermont Avenue at a price not to exceed \$125,778 and such work is to commence as quickly as possible.

7. Resolution identifying Polling Place for Village Election June 16, 2026

On motion by Mayor Oliviero and seconded by Trustee Davidov, the following resolution was unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Election Law, the Board of Trustees is required to designate the polling place for the Village election to be held on June 16, 2026, and the hours of election,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the polling place for the Village election to be held on June 16, 2026 shall be the Village Hall, 30 Piermont Avenue, Hewlett, New York,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the hours of the said Village Election shall be from 12:00 noon to 9:00 p.m., inclusive.
