



CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

Monday, September 16, 2024

The Common Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Greg Kubarski on Monday, September 16, 2024, at 7:00 PM. All present stood and recited the Pledge of Alliance. Mayor Kubarski asked for affirmation of proper public notice to which City Administrator Josh Finch confirmed the meeting did receive proper public notice.

Roll call was taken with Alderpersons Leanne Beyer, Mark Lankey, Darrow Novy, Liz Parish, Randy Seeley, Pat Moen, and Rick Hanke present. Tom Hotek was absent.

Motion by Hanke, seconded by Beyer to approve the August 19, 2024, Common Council Minutes. Motion carried.

Motion by Lankey, seconded by Hanke to approve Resolution #10-2024-TID#5 Creation. Motion carried.



Motion by Beyer, seconded by Hanke to approve Resolution #11-2024-ARPA Fund Use Allocation. Motion carried.

Motion by Lankey, seconded by Hanke to enter closed session at 7:27PM. Sec. 19.85(1)(e), Wis. Stats., permits the use of closed sessions where governmental bodies are deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session.
