Chair Cathy Ward called the meeting to order at 9:01am. Committee members Cheryl Culver, Sylvann Welcome, Christine Bridenhagen, and Donna Scattergood were present along with Administrator Walter Kalms, Clerk/Treasurer Anastasia Bell and 3 members of the public via Zoom.

Ward moved, Bridenhagen second, to approve the agenda as posted. Carried 5-0.

Ward moved, Welcome second to approve the 2/8/2022 minutes as presented. Carried 5-0.

Public Input – Jim Hauffe, 633 Isle View Road, expressed interest in the round fish warehouse, the gray garage closest to the water, and the “L” addition of the other structure. Kalms noted that no decision has been made and the process may require Town Elector approval.

Mariners Park at Gills Rock – Ward reported the Maritime Museum is planning to collect their requested items this spring, the process to remove the house is progressing, a sign should be purchased, and it is yet to be determined if swimming access can be achieved in 2022.

Disc Golf on Town Property – Ward reported the property will be walked in the spring to determine the 9-hole course layout.

Compost Site on Town Property – Ward noted the Compost Coalition is working with Mighty Winds Farm to collect wastes from Liberty Grove establishments.

Klenke Garage – Ward reported on her review of the Phase I study and summarized a letter received from the Historical Society (LGHS) in 2018 requesting educational signage. Culver noted the shoring work occurred in 2002 and LGHS would be interested in items within the building. Her personal concerns are related to the landscaping and stability of the building. Kalms noted that the contamination issue is speculation at this time due to previous activities, and there may be funding available for the Phase II costs which would likely be applied for by the testing agency. Any individuals wishing to work inside the building should be appointed to a Town Committee for liability insurance reasons. Bridenhagen identified that the long-term goal be defined before progress can be made. It was the consensus that an assessment of the building will determine the need for a Phase II Study. The LGHS should identify how the Klenke Garage fits into their long-term goals prior to the May meeting.

Pickleball Courts – Ward noted she is investigating the potential costs and if funding is available from the Pickleball Association.

Correspondence – None.
