Clerk/Treasurer Anastasia Bell called the meeting to order at 9:07am. Committee members Sylvann Welcome, Mike Repp, and Christine Bridenhagen were present. Committee Chair Cathy Ward was excused. **Welcome moved, Repp second** to nominate Bridenhagen as chair of this meeting. Carried 3-0.

Welcome moved, Repp second, to approve the agenda as posted. Carried 3-0

Bridenhagen moved, Welcome second to approve the 10/12/2022 minutes as presented. Carried 3-0. Committee member Donna Scatter good arrived.

Public Input – Bell read the update provided by Cathy Ward noting the information booth parking lot has been expanded by the Town crew, the Service Club has installed a larger holiday display, and the Town is researching what is allowed regarding the existing trees/plants on the Grandview property in order to address the trees blocking the view.

Mariner Park – Bell reported Ward is gathering information to create a request for Bay Lakes Regional Planning to assist/create a concept plan without a boat launch that the Town could use when applying for financial assistance for future projects at the park.

Disc Golf – Bell reported Ward identified the course has not been marked and the weather will not likely cooperate for this to occur yet this fall. Bridenhagen requested signage in the park to direct people to course.

Mariner Park Website Information – The draft website created by Welcome was reviewed and various suggestions made.

Boat Washing Station – Repp reported on DNR and County requirements and provided examples of boat washing stations and noted pricing information is to come. Bridenhagen noted the launch area is tight on space and asked if there was another location for this, and if the Val-A could work. The other question raised was where the water ends up after washing occurs.

Dad used this hat when he was young. Says H W inside—Howard Weborg.

All ideas sound good. We have the big fishing cart that was used to haul nets from the boat to the shed for reeling. It was also used to haul the boxes of fish down the sidewalk to the Olson Trucking Company truck waiting at the end of the sidewalk. Could that be used some place???? No ideas in my head right now. I have my Dads hat that he used when he was young. We found it in the shed. We were hunting for that hat when the statue was made—found it after. The hat on the statue isn't correct. Will take some pictures and send you.



The LG HS has this picture of old Weborg dock —Andrew Weborg's house is way to the left. I have a picture someplace of Arthur Weborg's house too which was the next residence to be built there. You can contact Karen Moran (will send phone number) if the talk on the history of the dock area that Niles and I did was put on video. Some place I have my notes. Remind me next year and I will look up some of these things. I have bins full of fishing book work from way back when my Grandfather Alfred Weborg fished there.
