- 3. Individual public comment is limited to **5 minutes** and may be shortened by the meeting chairperson if not respectful and productive in manner.
- 4. When a meeting is attended by a group of people who share the same or opposing views on a public comment topic, the chair may require that the group(s) designate not more than two spokespersons and limit the total time public comment to 5 minutes for each point of view or side of an issue.
- 5. Individual time may not be assigned/given to another.
- 6. A public hearing is meant to encourage comment and the expression of opinion, not a direct debate, nor should a commenter be intimidated by a village board member. Should a village response be asked, The Village Board of Trustees may offer explanation or information to the public at that time. They also reserve the right to request the individual leave contact information with the Clerk to receive a more researched answer at a later time.
- 7. Individuals requesting response from the village board, not offered during the meeting, will be contacted by phone, email, letter, or request for in-person meeting.
- 8. All remarks shall be addressed to the board as a body and not to any individual member thereof.
- 9. Interested parties or their representatives may address the board at any time by written or electronic communications.
- 10. Speakers shall observe the commonly accepted rules of courtesy, decorum, dignity and good taste.
- 11. Village Board members are offered a 5-minute grace period for meeting start. If board member is more than 5 minutes late to the meeting, they will forfeit their right to participate and vote during the meeting.
- 12. While electronic devices are necessary for viewing documents and time keeping, as a courtesy to the public and fellow board members, Village Board Members must refrain from texting, e-mailing, and instant messaging during Board Meetings, except in the case of family emergencies.

Please note- During the course of regular business, discussion and commentary is limited to board members and village staff only. We ask for this courtesy, for the board and staff to conduct their business and discussion without interruption. All village board members and staff are available after the conclusion of a meeting for one on one discussion.

WHEREAS, the Village of Saranac Lake has proposed the construction of a new Emergency Services Complex, which is anticipated to be one of the most significant public infrastructure investments in Village history; and

WHEREAS, best practices identified by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) and other municipal finance experts recommend conducting a thorough Tax Impact Analysis early in the planning process for major capital projects to evaluate affordability, ensure transparency, and guide responsible decision-making; and

WHEREAS, residents, first responders, and members of the Village Board have expressed the need for clear, accessible information on how the proposed project would affect local property taxes, including both construction debt service and ongoing operational costs; and

WHEREAS, a Tax Impact Analysis will provide the Board of Trustees and the public with objective, professionally prepared estimates of potential tax impacts under multiple scenarios, including variations in project cost, grant funding, bond interest rates, and debt terms; and

WHEREAS, conducting such an analysis now will strengthen community trust, protect taxpayers, and align the Village with prudent fiscal management practices observed by other municipalities in New York State;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Saranac Lake hereby authorizes and directs the Village Manager to engage a qualified, independent municipal financial advisor to conduct a Tax Impact Analysis for a proposed Emergency Services Complex; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the scope of the Tax Impact Analysis shall include:

- 1. A comprehensive estimate of project costs and financing assumptions, including debt service schedules.
- 2. Clear calculation of the projected impact on the Village tax levy and the average homeowner's tax bill.
- 3. Consideration of multiple scenarios, including variations in project cost, outside funding, and financing structures.
- 4. Estimated changes to operating costs associated with the new facility.
- 5. A written report and public presentation of findings at a Village Board meeting, with opportunities for public questions and input.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the results of the Tax Impact Analysis shall be made publicly available.

### 1. Community Enhancement Programming

- Under the direction of the Village Manager, the three Advisory Boards will identify free community programming and installations.
- Appropriated funds shall be distributed equally among the Advisory Boards (DAB, PTAB & SLACAB), unless otherwise agreed upon by the Advisory Board Chairs and the Village Manager.
- The Village Manager shall determine whether a project requires Board approval or may be administratively approved, contingent upon available funding within the fiscal year.

### 2. Community Enhancement Project(s)

- Under the direction of the Village Manager, the Community Enhancement Fund Committee (made up of two representatives of each Advisory Board) shall recommend project(s) to the Village Manager.
- The Village Manager shall determine whether a project requires Board approval or may be administratively approved, contingent upon available funding within the fiscal year.
- All recommended projects must be directly tied to the annual goals of the Advisory Boards or to one or more of the following adopted plans: the Downtown Saranac Lake Strategic Investment Plan (2024), the Arts and Culture Master Plan (2018), the Park Vision Plan (2018), and the Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan.

**WHEREAS**, the adopted Village Fiscal Year 2025–2026 Budget has appropriated \$10,000 for Community Enhancement Programming under account 001-6410-0400, and \$10,000 for Community Enhancement Projects under account 001-7110-0200;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Village Manager and the Village Treasurer to transfer the \$10,000 currently appropriated to account 001-6410-0400 into account 001-6410-0400-1115; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees authorizes the Village Treasurer to amend the account description of 001-6410-0400-1115 from "Downtown Program" to "CEFC Programming."

### **Terms:**

Four years with staggered terms to ensure continuity. The terms that will be expiring in May of 2026 will be decided upon by September 8, 2025 meeting.

The Village Board is responsible for filling vacancies.

### **Anticipated Activities:**

- Hold regular meetings to discuss an Emergency Services Facility.
- Conduct an existing facility assessment.
- Identify existing facility deficiencies.
- Create a vehicle/large equipment inventory.
- Conduct a preliminary needs assessment.
- Determine the current and future space needs based on current and future staffing, current and future vehicles/equipment, and other factors.
