WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22, 2026
(Unapproved)

1. Call to Order & Roll Call

The March 27, 2026 meeting of the Green Tier Legacy Community Committee was called to order by Administrator Andrews at 3:05 P.M.

Motion by O'Hearn to nominate Smythe as temporary chair, second by Wiebe. Motion carried – all ayes.

Present: Mary Smythe, Jill Wiebe, Lisa O'Hearn, and delayed members joining later in the meeting; Paula Anschutz and Louise Howson.

Staff: Benjamin Andrews Village Administrator, Sarah Bertges Administrative Assistant and Erik Linczmaier Parks & Streets Director.

2. Approval of the Agenda

Andrews requested amending the agenda to move item 5c (Composting Program Implementation Status) to first position in the discussion items to accommodate Erik's schedule.

Motion by Wiebe to approve the agenda as amended, second by O'Hearn. Motion carried- all ayes.

3. Approval of the Minutes – March 27, 2026

Motion by Wiebe to accept the minutes as written, second by Smythe. Motion carried-all ayes.

4. Comments, Correspondence, and Concerns from the Public

No members of the public were present. Smythe noted communication regarding the Green Tier Legacy Communities quarterly member meeting held on Monday, March 30, 2026, which was included in the meeting packet.

5. Discussion/Action Items

c. Composting Program Implementation Status

Andrews provided background on the composting program discussion from the previous meeting, noting that a volunteer third party would collect specialized buckets from restaurants throughout Sister Bay. The inquiry was whether the parks building could provide storage space and washing capacity for approximately 25-50 buckets.

Erik from Parks Department discussed storage and cleaning logistics. Key concerns identified included:

- Need for indoor storage of clean buckets (approximately 10x10 space required)
- Water access limitations at community gardens during winter months
- Drainage concerns about organic waste in floor drain systems at parks facility
- Alternative storage possibilities at Logger Quiz property

Howson explained the program details: participating restaurants include NWTC, Analog, Goose and Twigs, potentially The Pig, Al's Restaurant, Zero Sum, and Northern Grill. The program would operate year-round on a limited basis, with lighter activity during winter months.

Smythe suggested exploring whether Mighty Winds Farm could assist with bucket cleaning and storage. Cost sharing was discussed, with Climate Change Coalition of Door County agreeing to fund half of the bucket costs (\$15 each for 50 buckets) and volunteer coordinator Mike Schneider's stipend.

Linczmaier and Howson agreed to arrange a site visit with Schneider to evaluate storage options at both the community gardens and Logerquist property, considering seasonal water availability and cleaning logistics.

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a. Strategic Planning Framework For 2026 Green Tier Activities

Andrews presented a framework for strategic planning to organize the committee's annual goals and activities. The process would involve identifying major goals, establishing objectives, setting priorities and timelines, and assigning responsibilities. Andrews suggested this could be accomplished through a workshop format using brainstorming methods.

O'Hearn noted the committee had attempted similar planning efforts previously with limited success. Discussion focused on the need for an in-person workshop session to effectively develop the strategic plan.

Smythe emphasized the importance of understanding sustainability priorities from Destination Door County and Sister Bay Advancement to align efforts. Howson offered to provide DDC's updated strategic plan and suggested coordinating with the Climate Change Coalition.

The committee agreed to schedule a separate in-person workshop meeting to develop the strategic framework, covering activities from June 2026 through June 2027.

Motion by Wiebe to restore Howson as committee chair, second by Anschutz. Motion carried- all ayes.

b. Reusable Bag Procurement and Design Updates

O'Hearn reported on bag procurement pricing from August 2024: \$1.86 each for 1,000 pieces (12" x 13.5" x 7" recycled PET bags) with 3-4 month production timeline from Thailand. She noted the need to update pricing before proceeding.

Anschutz suggested incorporating the bag initiative into a broader plastic awareness campaign, including development of restaurant resource sheets. She indicated Ryan's donated design was abstract rather than Sister Bay-specific and recommended considering more locally-themed artwork. Discussion addressed material concerns, with Smythe questioning the use of recycled PET plastic given the committee's sustainability mission. Alternatives discussed included canvas bags, though cost implications were noted. Wiebe suggested researching Egg Harbor's canvas bag sourcing as a comparison.

The committee agreed to bring various bag samples to the in-person workshop for evaluation and to finalize decisions on material, design, and procurement approach.

d. Sustainability Policies for Municipal Landscaping and New Building Project

Andrews reported that the RFP for the new administrative building had been approved and would be issued soon. The committee's sustainability input would be provided to the selected architectural firm, including energy efficiency measures, solar panel readiness, and native landscaping considerations.

Anschutz raised the possibility of incorporating rain barrel and water catchment systems, noting the absence of such provisions in current village code. Smythe discussed potential county regulations requiring on-site stormwater management and the importance of permeable surfaces.

Howson noted the village's existing efforts on energy-efficient lighting and dark sky-friendly street lighting. The committee's recommendations will be forwarded as part of the building design process.

e. Updated Budget Request Consideration for Bags and Composting Equipment

Howson outlined the current budget status: \$2,500 allocated for 2026, with approximately \$600 spent on plants, leaving \$1,900. Additional costs include \$350-400 for composting buckets (split with Climate Change Coalition), leaving approximately \$1,500.

Discussion focused on requesting additional funds for the bag procurement project. Andrews noted the request could be submitted to the finance committee as an unbudgeted item up to a specified amount.

Based on comparison to the previous year's \$5,000 budget (of which only \$495 was spent), the committee agreed to request up to \$3,500 in additional funding, bringing the total potential budget to \$6,000.

4 **6. Matters to be Placed on Future Agenda, Referred to a Committee, Official, or Employee**

5 **a. Tree Canopy Enhancement and Reforestation Initiatives**

 8 Howson reported that four new hardwood trees have been ordered for planting in the waterfront
 9 park area north of village hall, scheduled for planting within the next month or two. These trees will
 10 contribute to future canopy coverage over the street area.

11 **b. Protecting Night Skies from Light Pollution**

12 Discussion referenced recent concerns about Sister Bay's impact on Newport State Park's Dark Sky
 13 designation. The committee has previously implemented stringent outdoor commercial lighting
 14 requirements.

15 Smythe suggested the committee could assist businesses in transitioning to appropriate LED colors
 16 and fixtures that direct light downward rather than outward. She noted successful light reduction
 17 experiments at Woodcrest Village.

18 Options for public education were discussed, including developing informational materials for
 19 homeowners and business owners. Howson noted Egg Harbor's success with sustainability-focused
 20 newsletters and suggested similar communication strategies for Sister Bay.

21 **Additional Item: Tree Giveaway Planning (Saturday May 9)**

22 Detailed planning was conducted for the upcoming tree giveaway event:

- 23 ● Location: Piggly Wiggly, 9 AM to 3 PM
- 24 ● Trees: 180 trees (10 trays of 18) in four species, stored at Jeff's residence
- 25 ● Staffing: Two shifts -8-11:30 AM (Wiebe, Anschutz, O'Hearn) and 11:30-3 PM (Smythe, Howson
 26 and neighbor.
- 27 ● Materials needed: Tags, informational handouts, tables, promotional materials
- 28 ● SBA promotional support confirmed

29 Anschutz will coordinate tree pickup logistics. O'Hearn will redesign tree tags featuring the Green
 30 Tier logo and environmental messaging. Howson will obtain informational handouts from the
 31 Climate Change Coalition regarding tree care and planting instructions.

Re: Tree Giveaway - Recap

The Sister Bay Green Tier Legacy Community Committee hosted a satellite Big Plant event outside the Piggly Wiggly beginning at 9:00 a.m. The event was supported by the Village Board and aligned with the county-wide goal of increasing climate resilience through expanded tree planting. Ten flats of conifer saplings were purchased through the Climate Change Coalition's Big Plant program and distributed to the public at no cost.

A total of 180 trees were given away, consisting of:

- 2 flats white spruce
- 2 flats balsam fir
- 3 flats white pine
- 3 flats red pine

Trees were offered on a one-per-person basis. The final red pine was claimed at approximately 2:40 p.m.

Event staffing was provided by community volunteers, including:

- Paula Anschutz
- Mary Smythe
- Jacki Kieckhefer
- Jill Wiebe

Volunteers distributed saplings, provided care instructions, and answered questions related to tree planting, the Big Plant program, Green Tier initiatives, and broader community sustainability topics.

\$231 in donations were received, dedicated toward purchasing buckets for the new Sister Bay Composting Initiative.

Overall, there was strong engagement with residents seeking guidance on tree care and local sustainability programs.

Special thanks were expressed to:

- Piggly Wiggly for hosting and partnering with the Sister Bay GTLC.
- Innovative Printing for producing informational handouts provided to participants.

The 2026 Big Plant tree giveaway successfully advanced community sustainability goals, strengthened local engagement, and contributed 180 new trees toward climate resilience efforts in Sister Bay and the surrounding county.

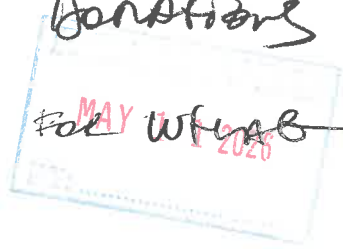

Reusable Bag Ideas

Sister Bay Green Tier Legacy Community

Background: The GTLC is considering the implementation of a plastic bag ban for Sister Bay. If such a ban is put into place, we would like to be able to provide reusable bags at low or no cost for Sister Bay residents. These bags could also be sold to Sister Bay visitors if they are unique and fun!

Option #1: Recycled PET grocery bags:

These would be similar to those available for purchase at the Pig or other grocery stores such as Trader Joe's. Ecology Sports in Sister Bay currently uses a similar (but smaller size) bag for some of their customers. I actually used the tag inside one of those to find this vendor, Custom Earth Promos.

If we go this route, I would consider either a contest to design the bag, or ask a Sister Bay artist to do so. The sky is the limit in terms of what this can be - full color, any design - totally customizable with lots of "surfaces" to personalize. Getting a sponsor (Piggy Wiggly?) would also be a huge help - someone like the Pig could also then sell the bags themselves.

Some options of this type of bag with pricing. I have samples of all of these.

- a. My personal top choice. I like the woven handles better than "self fabric" handles. These bags are quite thick and sturdy. This size (12" x 13.5" x 7") can be adjusted to something larger. If we do something like this, it is fully customizable - all sides can be our own design. For 1000 pieces, the cost is \$1.86 each. The production shipping time is substantial - probably about 3-4 months.



Option #2: Canvas Tote Bags

Alternatively, we could also provide / sell canvas bags. They would need to be sufficiently sturdy (heavy canvas) with a large enough gusset to make them useful (ie, not a book bag that has no “width” to it). ToteBagFactory.com has a huge selection of tote bags that can be either screen printed (up to six colors) or digital printed (all colors). I worked with them earlier in 2024 to make a digitally printed tote bag using original art - it turned out beautifully. If we went this route, I'd probably just do the “Green Sister Bay” logo on one or two sides of the bag. The area for printing on these bags is much smaller, and the price is bigger. The lead time is only a couple of weeks since they have the bags and they just print them.

Canvas bag choices:

- The tote bag mentioned above that I have done. It is 12 oz. cotton canvas. The prices below are for two color screen printing on both sides. Price for 1000 - \$6.13 each (note, you can get very small quantities of this at higher pricing)



Dear Sister Bay Business Owner,

Happy Spring from the Sister Bay Green Tier Legacy Community Committee! Our committee was formed by the Village Board in November 2021 with the following mission statement: “The Sister Bay Green Tier Legacy Community Committee works towards educating the Village Board, community leaders and citizens on the benefits of sustainability.” Since then, we’ve worked together with the village in a variety of areas including promotion of proper recycling practices, ban of coal-tar sealants, and the semi-annual electronics recycling day in the Village. We also partner with the Climate Change Coalition of Door County to offer free trees to residents as part of their annual “Big Plant” every year around Earth Day.

Our focus for 2025 is reducing the use of plastics in Sister Bay - in particular, single-use plastic bags.

To help encourage the use of reusable shopping bags, we are looking to produce our own laminated RPET shopping bags with original Sister Bay inspired artwork by local artist, Ryan Miller, featured on the front and back. We have a supplier who can produce such a bag, designed and produced specifically for us. We are looking for area businesses to help sponsor the production of these bags. As a sponsor, your logo would be included on the side of the bag.

As more people take reusable bags to grocery stores, etc. we will see a reduction in the use of single-use plastic bags, reducing the amount of plastic in our waste stream. In addition to the positive environmental impact, sponsorship of the bag would be a great marketing tool for your business!

We plan to order 3,000 bags, sized approximately 13” W x 15” H x 7” D - similar in size to a grocery store paper bag. A portion of the bags will be given out to Sister Bay residents with the remaining sold to visitors and other interested parties.
