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**MINUTES**  
**Village Board - Village of Summit**  
**March 13, 2025**

**CALL TO ORDER**

President Riley called to order the Village Board meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 13, 2025 at Summit Village Hall, 37100 Delafield Road, Summit, WI.

**ROLL CALL AND CONFIRM POSTING**

Administrator Michael took roll call and confirmed that the meeting was noticed to the local media as required and requested and posted to the Village posting board and website. Trustees present were: Jim Petronovich, Kraig Arenz, Sr., Justin Phillips and Jeff Lee. Also present were: President Jack Riley, DPW Director Kamron Nash, Planner Amy Barrows, Police Chief Mike Hartert and Administrator-Clerk/Treasurer Debbie Michael.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Mike Nevins, 849 N Pointview Road stated he read through the packet with regards to 10.C. related to road issue going through the Indian community and he didn't fully understand what was going on with that but it brought to mind a situation in one of our northern communities where there was a roadway going through an Indian reservation or community and on the other side of that the municipal roads were being used to access residential communities and they had some problems with the Indian communities who made some rules about ingress and egress and they only one that was winning on that was the attorneys. Hopes whatever this is that it spells out who owns the roads and the continuation of those roads, who is responsible for maintaining them including the plowing, mowing and patch work. He stated the document doesn't look like it truly defines who has total control of those roads.

Nate Rice, 37803 Valley Road – stated he spoke at the last meetings as well and applauds the board for their decision to vote down transferring land to the City of Oconomowoc, thinks that was wise and hopes they do that again tonight. Understands that some may change their vote and he understands that and wants them to do what's best for the Village. What he should have said the last time is to thank the staff because he knows they tried to get the parkway through and it's the right thing to do. As someone who has lived on Valley Road since 2003, its been a generation since then and they haven't completed it and yes, he bought a house at the intersection knowing it could be dangerous and knowing there would be traffic but ultimately thinking at some point it they will put the parkway through and had faith in Oconomowoc that they'd get it done. The County lined up, paved the road and ready to transfer, the City of Oconomowoc says no, they can do that and they have done that and they continue to build subdivisions to the north and northwest and all the traffic comes down Valley Road. Now, the County is asking Veridian Development to put in a three-way stop at Silver Lake Street and Valley Road, right in front of

their house. As a condition to get access to Concord Road/CTH BB the County is asking Veridian to build and pay for those improvements to the intersection. He has talked to a lot of people on Valley Road as well as people who take their kids to Silver Lake Intermediate School and can't imagine that people will want to stop and while it will slow people down, there will be a line of cars, especially to the east of that stop sign that are going to block people's lake access, there will be start/stop, start/stop of dump trucks for however long they continue to build for the next 10-15 years. He added that we became a Village so we couldn't have lands taken from us by the City of Oconomowoc, they've annexed our land for so long and now Town of Oconomowoc has done the same with Lac LaBelle partnering up so they can't be annexed. Oconomowoc comes to us now and wants us to cooperate and play ball with them to allow them to take some of our land again and he hopes the board doesn't just give it away because how many cards do we have to leverage the City of Oconomowoc to sit down and put a commitment, that is legally binding, to build this parkway otherwise they will keep playing us for fools saying Summit won't do anything and tonight's the night to take action and do something about it. If the parkway goes through the Paganica pipe will have to be addressed in a responsible way that protects the water quality of Silver Lake, and take all the salt off the County Highway by pushing that traffic onto the parkway. That would be a win because the chloride levels are gradually going up in Silver Lake every single year. So that would solve two problems for our community. The biggest thing that he talked about last time was Silver Lake Intermediate School and response times for EMS, these are Village of Summit kids going to school with City of Oconomowoc kids and we need to partner with the City to fix that and apparently maybe the City is tone deaf to that and will continue to roll the dice like the Lisbon Road accident. So maybe we are just going to have to wait until something really bad happens, someone is run over, killed on Valley Road by Silver Lake or there's an accident at the middle school, mass casualty even of even a student that lost oxygen to the brain and our EMS isn't going to be able to get there as fast as we would want them to and somebody dies. Mr. Rice stated he thinks it is very ironic that Matt Rosek, City Council Chair, in an article in the paper he was talking about how great the referendum was for the Fire Department and how response times have come down in a big way (he stated he will send the article to the Village Board), he was basically making a case for the parkway himself, even though he's made public statements saying it is none of their concern about Summit, they have to deal with it themselves and while they build subdivisions that affect Summit, that's their problem. He thinks that is callous, indifferent and unacceptable and people need to buck up before there is something bad that happens. He is here tonight as a citizen but also as a Lake Management Board and he would be happy to go before that body and try to rally the community around Silver Lake to agree to help fund the parkway because they have a big interest in that being done, related to the water quality. We all need to come together and build a partnership and stand strong and need the Village to fight for them to get this done and by voting no tonight that will show Oconomowoc that we are serious and are going to actually do something.

Jessica Rice, 37803 Valley Road stated she is Nate's wife and thanked the board for the opportunity to speak. This morning she went on the deck to look at the ice reseeding from the lake and felt such peace and joy listening to the ducks, geese, and songbirds basking in sunshine and celebrating the warm weather from Valley Road there was a periodic swish sound from a car which made it more difficult to hear the birds, but that is something she is used to. Imagine if this serenity was taken away permanently. This quiet is already not the case on Valley Road, when construction vehicles are passing by, or when vehicles with old mufflers, squeaky brakes, loud music, or acceleration pipes go by on the road. Maybe the board needs to have a coffee on her deck before they vote, then they could experience the irreparable harm they would be doing to their own tax base if they decide to give this land away. Also, at the Village Park, she was the one picking up dog poop throughout the park and leftover baseball trash (like gum and wrappers) all over in the backstop areas and picnic grounds, but she stopped going to the park because she got cancer and all of a sudden she heard they had a dog poop problem in the Spring. Her husband and she have been the ones charged with the help of other volunteers to keep Valley Road clean, especially by the Oconomowoc business center, one of the gateways to our communities. 35 plus bags of trash

when she was still keeping track and doesn't include large items like axles, large pieces of styrofoam or other large items they've found. They also did this during the drug epidemic and all of that would've filtered down into the lake. What she is trying to convey is that they have quietly gone about making their community better, volunteering their time, even if it wasn't their land but a place they use and care about and want others to think good things about and have a good experience. They have tolerated the road traffic but enough is enough. For 22 years they have experienced endless traffic from the City's developments while the Oconomowoc Parkway just sits unfinished. For those who enjoy the serenity of Silver Lake, even if you don't live on Valley Road, you will be affected during your lake experience the longer it takes for the parkway to go through. You should care about and advocate for your tax base and your neighbors. Mrs. Rice read a list of Oconomowoc developments that have gone in starting with the creation of the parkway to present and it is shocking how much development has been approved without also completing the Oconomowoc Parkway: Briarwood, Valley Green Condominiums, Parkway Green, Oconomowoc Fairway Condos, Riverline, Silver Ridge, the neighborhood north and east of Silver Ridge, the neighborhood west of Silver Ridge, Silver Lake Intermediate School, Vespera 1 & 2, Hickory Wood Farms 1, 2 & 3, Silver Lake Trails, Evan, Morgan Station, Evan 2, Arrowwood, Olympia Fields and Stapleton Realty's land which has not yet been developed. She is asking that the Village not give land away when all they have done regarding traffic has been to make their quality of life suffer and risk their safety. Do not give the land away until they agree in a written contract to put the parkway through.

Amy Underberg, 34916 Parkway Drive stated she has been a resident for 14 years, thanked the board for serving on the board, also hopes that they continue to stick to their vote of no and agrees with getting the parkway completed and her reason for that is she has children that go to Summit School Elementary School, one of which has a medical condition. The stop and go traffic has her extremely concerned. If her child were to stop breathing because of her medical condition, and going without oxygen to the brain longer than four minutes, could be fatal or cause a lifelong illness. Concerned that stop and go traffic will delay EMS getting through. Hopes that the board votes no and works to push to get that roadway through.

Leslie Boerger, 37620 Valley Road stated that Brad Bella submitted an email today and that she is here to represent their household and to ask the board to continue to vote no against this motion. Some key things: the road is narrow, no place to pull over, has watched our police officers be at great risk when having people pulled over and that's only going to get worse as we pull in people from all the rural areas to go to Costco, which is really one of the motivations behind this, that traffic is only going to increase and the all that stuff that Rice's have spoke about. They choose to live there and are grateful to live there and to live in this community but it is becoming more challenging to live there every day. There is more and more garbage every day because they just throw it out the window and the average speed is not 25 miles per hour. Asking the board to please vote no against it for her reasons and the reasons presented today.

Ryan Carriveau, 37809 Valley Road stated that over the last three years, the City of Oconomowoc have approved construction of multiple subdivisions that impact the Village of Summit. Several homes have been approved to the west on Valley Road. He does not oppose development but he does take issue with the impact that those developments have on their neighbors and he doesn't feel that is being addressed specifically Valley Road. He also stated he often has difficulty accessing his property due to congestion. They are often left waiting for a kind neighbor to let them in or out of their driveway and it is extremely dangerous to try and back out of the driveway and if they have guests, that's an increased problem and they have to have someone out there watching for traffic. They choose to live in that location but the amount of traffic that has increased over the last few years due to the subdivisions, should be addressed. It is his understanding that some studies are being done to address the increased traffic but believes the most impactful would be the completion of the Oconomowoc Parkway, something that the

City seems to be in no hurry to do. He thinks that this would benefit the Village as a whole, but especially the residents on Valley Road. There is no shoulder to speak of on Valley Road which creates an issue with delivery trucks, garbage trucks, but especially emergency vehicles navigating the road. The parkway would be four lanes wide and would be a faster and safer alternative for every one to use in these situations. As the Village works to approve developments and negotiate with the City about access to future developments he is asking the board to use their leverage to compel the City to complete the parkway. He is aware of current hurdles in accomplishing this.

Trustee Lee stated that they do a great job and we should make sure to recognize them, Sean Osborne and his group has done this every year and raised a lot of money.

Designation of \$20 donated funds from Lois Erdmann to the Community Outreach Fund

**MOTION:** (Lee, Phillips) *to approve the designation of \$20 in donated funds from Lois Erdmann to the Community Outreach Fund.*

Trustee Lee directed his comment to Chief and stated kudos to Matt for doing a great job here to help this person who had car trouble and thinks we need to go out of our way to recognize people that do the right thing and raise the bar. Chief stated he explained to the person that they couldn't accept this, they were just doing their jobs and asked if they could use it for community outreach.

Carried.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Phillips) *to suspend the rules and consider Items 10.B. and 10.C. as next items of business.*  
Carried.

### Update on ATV/UTV Waukesha County roads access

Supervisor Wayne Euclid reported that this was passed by Waukesha County and will be in place from April 1 – October 31, 2025. Plan for Village of Summit would be to do a similar ordinance in 2026 to ask for Sawyer Road, Golden Lake Road and CTH DR as a test pilot.

Trustee Arenz stated that he is creating a work group to try and have something in front of the County in early 2026. Many communities are asking what the path is and wanting to hear the same things and in the past two weeks there are three additional communities that have passed ordinances. Before the end of the year there will be in the double digits of communities in Waukesha County looking at this same issue.

Chief Hartert stated that Village of Dousman adopted an ordinance based on Summit's Ordinance this week but excluded county roadways, he wrote up the deposit schedule and that was adopted as well so, Dousman is ready to go in about a week to a week and a half.

### Discussion and action on Waukesha County's agreement with Forest County Potawatomi Community for a portion of CTH BB (N. Golden Lake Road) to be added to the National Tribal Transportation Facility Inventory (NTTFI)

Supervisor Euclid reported that this ordinance has been passed by Waukesha County DPW Committee 5 to 1. There is a big project planned for 2027 and repaving in 2026 and potentially the tribe can donate money towards those projects. Corporate Council gave the opinion that this is just a Memorandum of Understanding and the details would be agreed to in the future. Goes before the County Board March 25.

Trustee Lee asked where letters should be sent from Village residents. Supervisor Euclide said either him or Sarah Spaeth, Chief of Staff of the County Board. Trustee Lee added that if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

President Riley announced that they are going to table the jurisdictional transfer, Item 7.H. so if people are here for that, they don't have to stick around.

## PLANNING DEPARTMENT

### Update on Plan Commission matters

Planner Barrows reported there are two Certified Survey Maps later on the agenda.

### Update on Zoning Code Land Use Project

Planner Barrows reported that the Sub-Committee had the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting tonight. Contractor's yards and Commercial Truck Parking were the topics. Next meeting will be before the April regular meetings. Didn't get into the event facilities discussion. Group is doing good.

Discussion and action to provide direction to staff related to the public engagement process for event facilities and agri-tourism type uses to be discussed by the Zoning Code Sub-Committee at a future meeting

Planner Barrows stated we will be moving on to event facilities and agri-tourism uses. Recommend that we establish a listening session or public hearing to include a joint meeting between the Village Board and Plan Commission to listen to the public so that's a separate session to help the sub-committee make their recommendations. This saves several repeats at other meetings. There would be no recommendations or taking actions just listen to public comments. Not specific to any one proposal, looking for general feedback. End of April/beginning of May is the suggested timeline.

The monthly report was reviewed.

Discussion and action on Genesee Lake Road Park parking lot design

**MOTION:** (Lee, Phillips) *to approve the proposed parking lot and stormwater facilities design at Genesee Lake Road Park and to authorize staff to bring forward to the Village of Summit Plan Commission for approval.*

To Discussion and action on Genesee Lake Road Park parking lot bid documents & ad for bids

**MOTION:** (Lee, Phillips) *to approve the bidding documents for the Genesee Lake Road Park parking lot as prepared by SEH and to authorize SEH to proceed with advertisement for bids.* Carried.

Discussion and action on 2025 Road Paving bid documents & ad for bids

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to approve the bidding documents for the 2025 Road Paving Program as prepared by SEH and to authorize SEH to proceed with advertisement for bids.* Carried. Petronovich opposed.

Discussion and action on Oconomowoc Area Baseball Club (OABC) proposal to construct new baseball fields & batting cages at Genesee Lake Road Park

Director Nash stated this plan would shift the fields nominally to the south. Trustee Arenz stated that they didn't want to change anything with the stormwater, we will have to put a boardwalk to traverse the land where there is a drop off. Trustee Lee asked about donations of poop bags from 5-O's. He also brought up changing the name.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to direct staff to continue to move forward with OABC on this proposal.* Carried.

Discussion and action on N. Dousman Road multi-use trail placement and exception letter approval to WisDOT for Genesee Lake Road Park property

Director Nash explained that this is approval to have the path on Park property, there is no dedicated right of way so the property line goes to the center of the road, but want to make sure the path is to the south of the tree line so we don't have to cut any trees down.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to approve the proposed layout of the multi-use trail on the south side of Genesee Lake Road with construction of Genesee Lake Road Park property.* Carried.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to authorize the Public Works Director to sign the written agreement concurring that the project will not adversely affect the Genesee Lake Road Park property, per 23 CFR 774.13(g).* Carried.

Discussion and action on donation request from Kettle Moraine Rec Sports

Director Nash stated we had a new group come in late 2024 and are looking for donations to operate their programs. KMRA has already provided a payment to the Village of \$3,000 to pay back for years that the Village contributed to them.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to approve the reallocation of \$3,000 to Kettle Moraine Rec Sports, utilizing funding that was reimbursed to the Village by the Kettle Moraine Recreation Association in early 2025.* Carried.

Discussion and action on jurisdictional transfer request from City of Oconomowoc for Pabst Farms Boulevard

Discussion and action on purchase of road salt on WisDOT Bid for 2025-2026 Winter season

**MOTION:** (Lee, Arenz) *to authorize the Public Works Director to participate in the statewide sodium chloride bid and to enter into a municipal agreement with WisDOT for the 2025-2026 winter season.* Carried.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### Monthly Report

Chief reviewed the monthly report.

### Discussion and action on cameras for Village Hall & DPW Buildings

Chief stated that when a walk through was done, there were some additional areas that were discovered that lacked coverage and we would like to have special camera views that would read license plates.

**MOTION:** (Arenz, Lee) *to approve the revised CIP Camera expenditure with a total project amount of \$18,518.*

There was discussion on where the additional funding will come from. Chief Hartert stated he can ask Silver Circle if we can use some of that \$5,000 donation towards this.

Carried.

## VILLAGE BOARD

### Discussion and action on options for communication with City of Oconomowoc related to road projects

President Riley stated that this on the agenda based on the email that Trustee Lee sent asking for a joint meeting with the Village and the City Council to talk about these projects. He doesn't know if that is the best way forward and thinks they should figure out alternative ways for us to stay up to date on what's happening in Oconomowoc and also relay the concerns that we have heard here tonight around Valley Road and other issues. If they all got in a room together, he doesn't think it would be very productive and there has to be a better way to do that and that was his reasoning for putting this on the agenda and would like to hear the other board member's ideas.

Trustee Arenz stated he liked the method we had before but maybe do it with more of a regular cadence between President Riley and/or staff, to be able to understand what their thoughts are and for them to understand what our concerns are and on a more frequent basis, rather than the last time being 18 months ago relative to the parkway.

Trustee Lee stated it is more than the parkway, comments being made that they don't really care what happens outside of the City, if it doesn't affect the City then they aren't concerned about it. That is not a spirit of collaboration. To tell us to go take out a loan and donate the money to the City and Waukesha County to have the parkway extended, that is not spirit of cooperation or collaboration. Then to turn around and ask us to turn over jurisdiction of one of our roads after comments like that were made months ago. He doesn't understand. Trustee Arenz replied that from a procedural standpoint, he agreed with President Riley that if we all got together in a room, it wouldn't be productive. How do we put together a path or process to continue to communicate on a more

frequent basis and to have both sides understand the concerns to a greater degree. Trustee Arenz acknowledged that he knows what meeting Trustee Lee is talking about. Trustee Lee added that it isn't even just that, in the December 3 meeting they voted unanimously that construction traffic for the Arrowhead project should go down Valley Road, and he gets that it is a County road but they know we have traffic issues with Valley Road and they unanimously voted to send construction traffic down Valley Road and there has to be a better solution to that. Trustee Phillips stated then the solution is to encourage Chief to put a lot of officers on Valley and if they are going 26 or over, we help them find a cheaper alternative. President Riley stated we aren't going to solve that one tonight either. The agenda item is to try to come up with a way to stay informed and make sure the City is aware of our concerns and if there is anything the City is looking for, we would be aware of those as well. Trustee Phillips asked if we should we put something together as the board in response to some of those comments in the Oconomowoc Enterprise. Trustee Lee responded that he doesn't know if that would be productive.

President Riley stated he was thinking of a regular meeting with himself and the Mayor and our Administrators. Monthly, bi-monthly or as needed. We could have an item on our agenda every month to state our concerns. There was discussion on how frequently this meeting would take place. Trustee Lee stated he's happy to join if Alderman Rosek does.

Trustee Lee added the other comment that was made is how much traffic Summit is creating driving down Silver Lake Street to go shopping and to eat in their restaurants. He's not sure if they are actually asking that we don't do that anymore because he knows that his family alone spends a lot of money in the City of Oconomowoc and he is certain there are a lot of other residents in the Village of Summit that do as well. He's not sure if that's what the ask was, for us to stop doing business in the City of Oconomowoc. President Riley responded he doubts it.

Trustee Petronovich stated the big problem is Valley Road. Trustee Lee stated and the parkway is part of it too and with the newest Arrowhead subdivision that three-way stop sign that's going to go at Valley and stop traffic going both directions, not even all the residents have figured this out yet we saw a handful of them tonight. Trustee Petronovich stated the Police departments work well together and Public Works certainly does so the only issue is Valley and wishes they could get the problem with the parkway resolved. Trustee Lee stated that the three-way stop sign is going to affect city residents and they are going to want something done about it too because that is going to cause them a huge problem getting to and from their homes. A good thing is that it will slow traffic down on Valley Road but he doesn't think the Village should be responsible for holding the bill on the parkway like it has been suggested just because it's going to benefit Valley Road. President Riley stated these are all topics that are part of the discussion on Valley Road but are not part of the communications with the City of Oconomowoc related road projects on our agenda.

President Riley stated the plan they are talking about is more often communications with the City and he thinks it will be a more formal discussion between the Mayor, himself and our Administrators, just so everybody is on the same page, that's a start. We will reach out to the City and make that happen.
