

The Annual meeting of the Longwood Town Electors was called to order at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 21, 2026 by Chair Art Petke. Those in attendance were: Art Petke, Jeff Rasmussen, Travis Greschner, Sue Devine and Bill Devine.

**AGENDA:** A list of topics to be discussed was available to all.

**MINUTES:** A motion was made by Jeff Rasmussen to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2025 annual meeting was seconded by Kathy Petke. All voted aye.

**TREASURER:** A motion was made by Kathy Petke to accept the financial reports as of 12/31/25 was seconded by Travis Greschner. All voted aye.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Art Petke reported that 7 loads of gravel had been hauled in on Resewood Ave. near Glenn Zimmerman's residence but washout is still an issue. Glen offered to install drain tile if the town contributed \$1k.

It was reported that gravel bids were opened at the 04/8/26 regular board meeting and the 2026 contract was awarded to Haas Sons. Gravel bid was \$12.75 per yard and blue granite was \$13.93 per yard. Residents may purchase at a rate \$1.00 more than the town price and it must be delivered on days work is done on town roads.

The contract for Calcium Chloride dust control was awarded to Slobodnik Gravel & Excavating at a cost of \$1.58 per gallon.

Clark Electric cut down numerous trees including troublesome trees on Resewood Ave.

Frost heaved the electrical entrance on the storage shed. The size and location of the shed are becoming an issue as it is too wet and the shed is not tall enough to add fill and still get machines in and out.

The shop roof has been leaking. Repair has been contracted and will be completed as weather allows.

Due to whole town reassessment Open Book is set for 09/09/26 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. and Board of Review is 09/16/26 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Longwood Town Hall.

Art Petke reported that the Fire District assessment increased to \$50,403.54 up \$1,729.54 from 2025.

The Fire District Pumper Truck has been paid off early saving the town a \$8,600 annual payment.

The board is working on making the black top roads into Class "B" roads.

The town of Hixon contacted the state and the Town of Longwood about how Hixwood Road has been maintained for the last many years. Meetings were held and Travis & Jeff met with Hixon to resolve the issue. Longwood will maintain ¼ mile of Hixon's road and will bill the Town of Hixon the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of each year.

A motion was made by Travis Greschner to hold the 2027 Annual Meeting on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of April 20, 2027 at 7:00 p.m. was seconded by Jeff Rasmussen. All voted aye.

The new brush cutter was used 3 times on town ditches in 2025.

A new patrol truck was received in 2025 and was completely paid off in March of 2026. The truck is currently at Monroe for inspection after the completion of the plowing season.

Groffdale Church donated approximately \$2,800 to help with road repair.

The town is working on setting up both Electronic & Tire recycling events for later in the summer. Dates will be posted as they are set.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jeff Rasmussen was seconded by Sue Devine at 8:15 p.m. All voted aye.
