

Town of Upham
Monthly Meeting
June 2, 2026

Chairman Stilen called the June meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. A full quorum was present including David Stilen, Randy Donovan, Glenn Dobrinska, Treasurer Tim Murphy, Clerk Leah Antoniewicz, and eight registered visitors.

The Clerk read the minutes of the May 5th Board Meeting. Chairman Stilen made a motion to approve the minutes. Supervisor Dobrinska seconded. Motion carried.

The Clerk read the Treasurer's report and reported the cash balance as of April 30, 2026, of \$331,260.89 with cash receipts as of May 31, 2026, of \$41,500.95 and cash disbursements as of May 31, 2026, of \$20,581.99 and a cash balance as of May 31, 2026, of \$352,179.85. Chairman Stilen made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Supervisor Donovan seconded. Motion carried.

Jed Mattmiller reported on the Bass Lake boat landing. The general permit has been verbally approved to extend the planks 21' from the existing planks. We can expect to have written approval within 30 days from applying for the permit. No public hearing is required. Estimated cost to obtain the permit is \$4,000.00. This should be on the July agenda for approval.

The Clerk presented the applications for liquor licenses for 2026-2027: Billy Timber's Pub & Eatery, Inc., (Billy Timber's Pub & Eatery), Antigo Bass Lake Country Club (19th Hole), The Highlander, LLC (Palace of Mirrors) and Hollandtown Minimart LLC (Summit Lake Store). Chairman Stilen made a motion to approve the liquor license as presented. Supervisor Dobrinska seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion took place to obtain bids for paving on Waterpower Road and gravel for various roads in the township. Chairman Stilen asked the clerk to post the bids separately in the Antigo Daily Journal Fifteen days prior to the July 7th board meeting. Bids are to be opened at the July 7th town board meeting.

Discussion took place regarding Maywood Road and where it ends past Greenway Lane. According to the gas tax information Maywood Road is 0.63 miles long and would extend approximately ¼ mile past Jeff Muelver's home. Jeff has a survey showing the road extends 0.26 miles (appx 372') past his home. Jeff said the Upper Clear Lake Association has aided in maintaining this portion of the road. They would like to see the town take over the maintenance (grading and plowing) of the ¼ mile owned by the town. Also, some remediation of the dust would be appreciated. Jeff asked the town to consider paving the ¼ mile stretch. Chairman Stilen said that portion of the road is corduroy. Chip sealing was discussed as a possible option. Chairman Stilen asked Tim Rusch to investigate the legal description of the road past Greenway Lane.

Chairman Stilen made a motion to pay the bills. Supervisor Donovan seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Stilen made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Supervisor Dobrinska seconded
