

Town of Whitefield
Select Board Meeting Minutes
June 2, 2026

Present: Seth Bolduc (Chair), Brent Hallowell (Vice-Chair), José Ambriz, and Yolanda Violette. Not Present: Erin Anderson and Brian O'Mahoney

1. Mr. Bolduc called the meeting to order.
2. Motion and second to approve and sign the minutes of May 19 carried 3-0.
3. Approved and signed the Accounts Payable/Payroll Warrants.
4. Roadside Brush Clearing: after consideration of their bid and a recommendation from the Roads Committee confirming their capability, there was a motion and a second to approve the J/K Farm bid of \$18,400. Motion carried 3-0. The contract was signed by Mr. Bolduc.
5. Road Paving: after consideration of their bid and a recommendation from the roads committee, there was a motion and a second to approve the Hopkins Milling and Paving bid of \$397,515.20. The motion carried 3-0. The contract was signed by Mr Bolduc.
6. The Roads Committee met with a state beaver biologist who suggested that beavers have overpopulated the Ben Brook/ Hollywood Blvd. marshland. The state biologist confirmed that trapping and relocating the beavers is one possible solution. The state biologist also suggested we may request state assistance in designing and implementing a new beaver deceiver at the Hollywood Blvd. culvert. The fire department is also willing to help clear the culvert of debris to better understand the extent of blockage and to gauge how quick it may get blocked again.
7. The Roads Committee is in need of new members. Discussion on how to recruit new members. Brent is willing to step into the chair position at this time and he will discuss it at the next roads committee meeting.
8. There was a motion and a second to approve the spending of \$2,800 for Morse Ground Works to clean up and landscape the Veteran's memorial in front of the Town Office. The motion carried 3-0.
9. There was a motion and a second to approve Delta's Emergency Ambulance Service Agreement FY 26-27 at \$60 per capita, total cost \$138,780.00. Delta offers a 5% reduction if paid in full. The motion carried 3-0. The contract was signed by Mr. Bolduc.
10. There was a motion and a second to approve the Midcoast Humane Agreement for Services FY 26-27 totaling \$3,804.64 for the year. The motion carried 3-0. The contract was signed by Mr. Bolduc.

11. Arthur Strout is working with three junkyard complaints. One on Mills Road and another across the street on Northeast Lane. Both residences are working to clean up and making progress. The Mills Road residence has requested an extension. A third and new complaint was recently filed about a place on the South Howe Road. The town has not yet confirmed a response.
12. The Town Office has a nest of Phoebe in the entryway roof that will delay finishing the trim work.
13. Payroll increases for FY 26-27 were presented. The Selectboard reviewed the new numbers reflecting the percentage increases previously approved at the town meeting. A motion and a second was made to approve these increases effective July 1, 2026. The motion carried 3-0.
14. The Olsen Park sign was presented for review after removal of parentheses.
15. New town emails are being set up for the office staff, select board, planning board, fire department, EMS and communications.
16. A motion and second to adjourn carried 3-0.

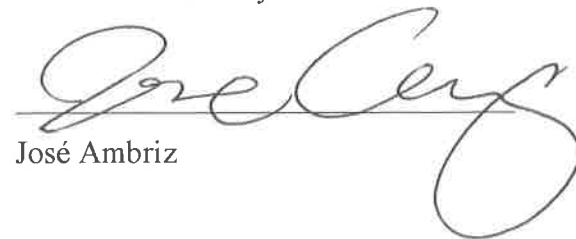
