

MINUTES
Twin Lakes Township
Wednesday, June 17, 2026
Town Board Meeting at the Twin Lakes Town Hall
5:00 p.m.

Board Chair Diane Felde-Finke opened the meeting at 5:00 p.m. Other board members present: Supervisor Randy Willie, Supervisor Mike Orlowski, Treasurer Cortney Carlson, Clerk Daisy Rose. Also present: Road Foreman Bob Olean.

Guests: Sue Zmyslony, Carlton County Commissioner, provided a brief county update. She thanked those that have participated in the comprehensive planning thus far.

MOTION to approve the June 3, 2026 town board meeting minutes as printed was made by Willie and seconded by Orlowski; all voted yes, the motion passed.

MOTION to pay all bills, check numbers 19607-19628 and electronic payments PERA26MJUN and BANK26MAY for the total amount of \$24,287.59 was made by Willie and seconded by Orlowski; all voted yes, the motion passed.

Carlson presented the treasurer's report.

OLD BUSINESS

- Paving Projects: Discussion on letters being sent out to residents receiving new mailboxes on West Chub Lake Road and Lakeview Drive, Rose will continue to work with the county on getting these mailed.

- Cologne Road- A resident previously contacted the township regarding concerns about truck traffic on the road. Olean addressed the matter with Chad Hamilton of Kiminski Paving, who discussed the issue with all drivers and ensured they were made aware of the proper protocol.

NEW BUSINESS

- Hall Rental: An application was received from Jane Willie for rental on July 5 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. for an anniversary party. **MOTION to approve Jane Willie's application for town hall rental on July 5 was made by Felde-Finke and seconded by Orlowski; all voted yes, the motion passed.**

- Carlton County 4-H: **MOTION to approve a 4-H trophy sponsorship donation in the amount of \$25.00 was made by Willie and seconded by Orlowski; all voted yes, the motion passed.**

- MN Demographic Center: The 2025 annual estimates were received; our population estimate is 2,159, and our household estimate is 838.

- Election Judges: **MOTION to appoint the following election judges for the Primary Election on August 11 and for the General Election on November 3, for the wage of \$15.00 per hour: Head Judge Sue Chapin, Head Judge Diane Felde-Finke, Lori Gamble, Marna Butler-Fasteland, Daisy Rose, Jane Willie (Primary only), Bob Fox (Primary only), Dow Rychlak, Melissa Parker, Monica Peterson and Julie Macor was made by Willie and seconded by Orlowski; Felde-Finke abstained, Willie and Orlowski voted yes, the motion passed.**

WLSSD: The board reviewed the township's proposed WLSSD Capacity Allocation Permit for 2027-2030. **MOTION to approve the WLSSD Capacity Allocation Permit was made by Willie and seconded by Orlowski; all voted yes, the motion passed.**

ROAD MAINTENANCE

- Hay Lake Road: A resident contacted the township regarding beavers blocking culverts. Olean is currently working to address the issue.
- Yndestad Road: A resident contacted Olean regarding beaver activity on county-owned land in the area. Olean will coordinate with Robert Dahl at the county to have the issue addressed.
- West Chub Lake Road: A resident reported a pothole near 2019 West Chub Lake Road. Korienek will fill the pothole.
- Moonlight Drive: A resident requested signage indicating that the road is not an outlet or, alternatively, that it is a dead-end road. Olean will work with the county to have signage installed.
- East Chub Lake Road / Chub Lake Park Road: A resident sent an email regarding a business sign that was placed on his property.
- Jay West Road and County Road 3: Concern about signage at this intersection which leads people to miss the turn. Olean will take a look.

CORRESPONDENCE

- Carlton County Zoning, notice of decision, rezoning by changing from A-1 Agriculture/Forest Management District to the A-2 Agriculture/Rural Residential Zoning District, 1427 Cologne Road, change in zone was granted.
- Carlton County Administrator's Office, letter addressed to the Interior Board of Indian Appeals about the Carlton County Board of Commissioners intent to appeal the May 11, 2026 decision regarding Division of Fee to Trust, Priority 20. Commissioner Zmyslony reported that the County's intent to appeal is in order to correct misinformation.
