

**INTER-MUNICIPAL AGREEMENT BY THE VILLAGE OF MILLBROOK AND THE
TOWN OF WASHINGTON TO ESTABLISH NYS ROUTE 44 AS THE DESIGNATED
TRUCK ROUTE FOR THE TOWN AND VILLAGE**

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2025, by and between the **TOWN OF WASHINGTON**, a municipal corporation, with offices located at 10 Reservoir Drive, Millbrook, New York 12545 (hereinafter the “Town”), and the **VILLAGE OF MILLBROOK**, a municipal corporation, with offices located at 35 Merritt Avenue, Millbrook, New York 12545 (hereinafter the “Village”).

WHEREAS, both the Town Board and the Village Board of Trustees acknowledge that certain streets and highways within the Town and Village are subjected to greater wear and deterioration than other streets and highways in the Town and Village as a result of trucks and other vehicles with heavy gross weights traveling over such streets and highways; and

WHEREAS, the Town and Village each has the authority to exclude trucks, commercial vehicles, tractors, tractor-trailer combinations, tractor-semitrailer combinations or tractor-trailer semitrailer combinations from streets and highways specified by the Town Board or the Village Board respectively pursuant to Sections 1660(17) and 1640(5) of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, in addition, the Town and Village each has the authority to establish a system of “Truck Routes” upon which all trucks, tractors, and tractor-trailer combinations having a total gross weight in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds are permitted to travel and operate and excluding such vehicles from all highways except those designated as such “Truck Route”, pursuant to Sections 1660(10) with respect to Towns and 1640(10) with respect to Villages of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board and the Village Board of Trustees have each determined it is in the best interest of the residents of their respective municipalities to establish a “Truck Route”

over which trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations weighing over ten thousand (10,000) pounds shall be permitted to travel and prohibiting such vehicles from traveling over any other streets or highways in the Town and Village except for local deliveries; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (“DOT”) has informed the Town and Village it will agree to the designation and use of New York State Route 44 (“Route 44”) as the “Truck Route” for the Town and Village, and provide the appropriate signage to designate Route 44 as the “Truck Route” for the Town and Village, provided the Town and Village enter into an Inter-Municipal Agreement to formally establish such “Truck Route”; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 5-G of the New York General Municipal Law, the Town and the Village are authorized to enter into a Municipal Cooperation Agreement to establish a “Truck Route” and prohibit trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations weighing over ten thousand (10,000) pounds from traveling on any other streets or highways in the Town or Village except for local deliveries.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by the Town, the Village and DOT as follows:

1. **Establishment of Truck Route for the Town and the Village.** The Town Board and the Village Board of Trustees hereby agree they shall each enact their own Local Laws designating the portion of Route 44 which runs through the Town and the Village as a “Truck Route”, upon which all trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations having a total gross weight in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds shall be required to travel and prohibiting such vehicles and combinations from traveling on all other streets and highways in the Town and Village.
2. Such Local Laws shall provide an exception to allow such vehicles and combinations to travel on the streets and highways of the Town and Village other than the “Truck Route” for the purpose of making local deliveries or pick ups of merchandise or other property.

3. In addition, such Local Laws shall require the Town and Village to install appropriate signage on the Town and Village streets and highways respectively indicating those Town and Village streets and highways prohibited to trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations weighing over ten thousand (10,000) pounds and directing such vehicles to the “Truck Route.”
4. Such Local Laws shall be enacted within ninety (90) days of the date of this Agreement.
5. Within thirty (30) days of the enactment of such Local Laws by the Town and the Village, the Village Clerk shall notify the DOT to install signage along Route 44 indicating it is the “Truck Route” to be used by trucks, tractors, and tractor-trailer combinations having a total gross weight in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds.
6. **Authority for Execution on Behalf of the Village.** The Mayor of the Village has executed this Agreement pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village at a meeting thereof held on July 23, 2025. Mayor Peter Doro, whose signature appears hereafter, is fully authorized and empowered to execute this Agreement and enter into such an Agreement on behalf of the Village. A copy of this Agreement shall be permanently filed, after execution thereof, in the office of the Village Clerk.
7. **Authority for Execution on Behalf of the Town.** The Town Supervisor has executed this Agreement pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the Town Board at a meeting thereof held on July 10, 2025. Town Supervisor Gary Ciferri, whose signature appears hereafter, is fully authorized and empowered to execute this Agreement and enter into such an Agreement on behalf of the Town. A copy of

this Agreement shall be permanently filed, after execution thereof, in the office of the Town Clerk.

8. **Notices.** Any and all notices, if any, required hereunder shall be addressed to the parties at the following respective addresses, or to such other addresses as may hereafter be designated in writing by either party hereto:

To the Village: 35 Merritt Avenue, Millbrook, New York 12545

To the Town 10 Reservoir Drive, Millbrook, New York 12545

9. **Binding Effect.** The covenants, terms and conditions herein contained shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors, assigns, and legal representatives.

10. **Modification.** No modification of any provision shall be valid unless in writing and signed by both parties.

Resolution #2025-006

To Recognize the Official Date of Establishment
of the Village of Millbrook Police Department to be
April 15, 1896

WHEREAS, According to the minutes, the Village of Millbrook Board of Trustees held a duly convened meeting on April 15, 1896, to establish Ordinances including “Duties of Officers on Complaints”, “Arrests for Violation Ordinances”, and “Obstruction of Officers” (that took effect immediately), and

WHEREAS, The minutes of May 7, 1896, reflect a special meeting of the Board of Trustees that was held to address a request by President (Mayor) Oakleigh Thorne for authorization to engage a “Night Watchman” (Police Officer) for the Village at a rate of \$1.50 per day. A motion approving Thorne’s request was made, seconded and carried. Subsequently, on June 11, 1896, President Thorne reported back to the Board that he had engaged John Madden to serve in the role of Night Watchman, working seven days a week at \$1.50 per day, and

WHEREAS, Minutes of the Board of Trustees are recognized as the official record for the Village of Millbrook.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Board of Trustees by way of archival research identify and approve the Official Date of Establishment for the Village of Millbrook Police Department to be **April 15, 1896**.

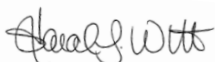

RESOLUTION No. 2025-005

Authorizing the Village to Enter an Inter-Municipal Agreement with Town of Washington to
Establish a Truck Route

At a meeting of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Millbrook (“Village Board”), held at the Village Hall, 35 Merritt Ave., Millbrook, New York on the 23rd day of July, 2025, at 6:00 p.m., Village Mayor, Peter Doro called the meeting to order, and _____, seconded by _____ Trustee _____, moved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees has determined certain streets and highways within the Village are subjected to greater wear and deterioration than other streets and highways as a result of trucks and other vehicles with heavy gross weights traveling over such streets and highways; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to establish a system of “Truck Routes” upon which all trucks, tractors, and tractor-trailer combinations having a total gross weight in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds are permitted to travel and operate and excluding such vehicles from all highways except those designated as such “Truck Route”, pursuant to Section 1640(10) of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (“DOT”) has informed the Village it will agree to the designation and use of New York State Route 44 (“Route 44”) as the “Truck Route” for the Town of Washington and the Village, and provide the appropriate signage to designate Route 44 as the “Truck Route” for the Town and Village, provided the Town and Village enter into an Inter-Municipal Agreement to formally establish such “Truck Route”; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined it is in the best interest of the Village to enter into an Inter-Municipal Agreement with the Town of Washington to establish Route 44 as a “Truck Route”; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board hereby approves the terms contained in the attached Inter-Municipal Agreement (“IMA”) with the Town of Washington establishing Route 44 as a “Truck Route” and authorizes the Mayor to execute such IMA on behalf of the Village.

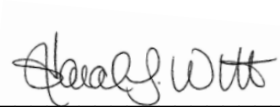
