To the Village of Palmyra Board:

Earlier this year, members of the Palmyra Historic Preservation Commission determined that 38 additional structures were eligible to be listed on Palmyra's Historic Registry. Based on qualifications previously set; age, historic significance, architectural significance and/or integrity, letters were sent out to these property owners asking if they would be interested in having their homes listed. Of those 38, 10 responded with an affirmative response. Following local ordinances, adjacent properties were notified of their intent and a public hearing was held.

The Palmyra Historic Preservation Commission respectfully requests that the Board approve following structures be added to the current registry bringing the total to 38 structures or sites on the local registry.
