Per the Village of Palmyra Historic Preservation Commission dictates, this request to have the following structures added to the Palmyra Historical Registry is formally submitted. These prominent historical addresses include:

104 W. Main Street, built 1884 as a harness shop

111 N. Third Street/300 W. Main St., built 1898, Uglow Building

210 N. Second Street, built 1912, St. Mary's Catholic Church

115 N. Third Street, built circa 1900, The American Legion

218 W. Main Street, built circa 1900, Prado Building/McKenzie Shoe Factory

Thank you for your consideration.

Additionally, the Palmyra Historic Preservation Commission will be holding a meeting on Tuesday, June 23, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. at the Village Hall for members of the community who are interested in learning more about the designation of a historic downtown district. Jason Tish and Elizabeth Hilton with the Wisconsin Historical Society will be present to discuss details and answer questions. Join us to learn about the proposed designation in the National Register of Historic Places and what it means for property owners. The National Register does not come with rules for owners but does make them eligible for tax credits for repairs, maintenance and rehabilitation. Representatives of the planning, zoning and building inspection committees are encouraged to attend also.

A formal invitation to this meeting will be sent to property owners in the proposed district-

W. Main Street - First to Fifth Streets

Second Street - Main to Maple

Third Street - Main to Taft

The agenda for the meeting will be posted on local information pages so that anyone in the community may attend.

On a side note, plaques for the newly appointed structures to the Palmyra Historic Registry will be presented to property owners on June 6th at the Ice Cream Social at the Historical Society.
