

MINUTES FOR THE AUGUST 12, 2025 TISKILWA VILLAGE MEETING

The Village of Tiskilwa held its regular meeting on August 12, 2025 at the Tiskilwa Fire Station at 135 High St. at 7:00 P.M. Answering roll call were Mayor Daniel Acker, Trustees Kayla Kunkel, Amy Kline, James Cole, Brett Klinefelter and John Funderberg. Absent was Trustee Yepsen. The updated Agenda was approved. Trustee Funderberg made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 8, 2025 Board meeting, seconded by Trustee Cole. All ayes.

Payment of Bills: Trustee Klinefelter made a motion to approve payment of bills totaling \$81,089.68 with 3 additions, seconded by Trustee Funderberg. All ayes on a roll call vote.

Treasurer's Report: Trustee Klinefelter made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as presented by Ginger Murphy, seconded by Trustee Cole. All ayes on a roll call vote.

Public Comment: There were six citizens present at the meeting. One with concerns about a culvert repair, one about free C.P.R. training and one about weather sirens. Three to observe the meeting.

Supervisor Report:

WATER TREATMENT PLANT:

Started chlorinating raw water to help with the rust issues.

Isolated Filter #4- not working properly

Continuing backflushing filters 2X a day.

Generator not working- gas valve stuck shut. Elmore Electric replaced

July 16- alarms at the water treatment plant and Lift stations due to the storm

Conducted 4 total dissolved solid waste tests in town. All came back normal range

Picked up 42 bags of filtration media from the Village of Cedar Point

103 water meters have been installed.

WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT:

No Issues.

LIFT STATIONS:

No issues

STREETS-STORM DRAINS:

Repaired south approach to Zigs Station.

Working on aprons and 2 storm drains on N. Washington St,

Bridge at N. State St-Old Mill Rd has a hole in it . The backfill washed out from heavy rains.

PARKS:

West Park- no issues

East Park- water pressure problems, researching. Conducted pressure test. 32PST

Numosh Park- waiting to hear from John's Sales&Service on the fountain installation. .

OTHER:

Large tree limb at 330 State St. removed

Picked up tree limbs around town from the storm .

Supervisor Report, con't

July 30 storm caused flooding at creek and street on main street

No new information on clogged drain at N. High St.

Installed drainage ditch at High St-OwensSt. For help with water ponding up..

REPORTS:

Trustee Klinefelter gave the water report as 89,300 gallons of water used, \$11,020.83 amount of water billed and \$7,602.25 amount of sewer billed. He also stated he helped mow the East Park before Pow Wow days due to the high grass.

The Police report showed 2 traffic stops, 105 security checks, five 911 calls, and 104.5 police hours worked. 2 traffic warnings and 1 ordinance violation. Colby Wittig will be starting soon as an additional part time officer.

Trustee Funderberg stated a citizen had trouble with silt from the hillside getting into their basement after the storm near the water storage tank which is a village street.

Online water payments for July showed \$6,386.08.

Village Engineer Jack Kusek updated the Board on West Park and the Water Tower.

OLD BUSINESS::

Water Plant Filter Maintenance-Trustee Klinefelter made a motion to award the bid from Putnam County Paint Co. for a maximum \$74,400.00 for 4 sand filters repaired, seconded by Trustee Kline. All ayes on a roll call vote.

Annual Report: Trustee Kline made a motion to approve the Annual Report seconded by Trustee Funderberg. All ayes.

Non Home Rule Retailers Tax: Trustee Klinefelter made a motion to adopt Ordinance 25-0812 implementing a Non-Home Rule Municipal Retailer's Occupation Tax and a Non-Home Rule Municipal Service Occupation Tax of 1.0%, seconded by Trustee Kline. All ayes on a roll call vote. This goes into effect in January.

NEW BUSINESS:

TCA Movie in the park: Mayor Acker asked that the East Park be mowed prior to the Movie in the Park on August 16th.

Weather Radios/Public Warning Siren- The Village Board considered going in with the Fire Department on purchasing weather radios for every household in town. There will be an interest survey sent out and your response will be helpful on this purchase.

There being no further business, Trustee Cole made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Trustee Klinefelter.
