The Tiskilwa Village Board held its regularly scheduled meeting on March 10, 2026 at the Tiskilwa Fire Station at 7:00 P. M. Answering roll call were Mayor Daniel Acker, Trustees Kayla Kunkel, James Cole, and John Funderberg. Absent were Trustees Brett Klinefelter and Dan Yepsen. Due to a lack of a quorum Mayor Acker voted on all issues. The Agenda was approved as presented.

Trustee Funderberg made a motion to approve the minutes for the February 10, 2026 meeting, seconded by Trustee Cole. All ayes.

Reports:

Village Engineer: Jack Kusek was unable to attend, but updated the Mayor on the Walnut St. bridge.

The Water report showed 825,100 gallons of water used. \$10,768.36 amount of water billed, and \$7,561.50 amount of sewer billed.

The Police report showed 16 security checks, no 911 calls and 26 hours worked.

Old Business:

Village Laborer Position- Trustee Kunkel made a motion to hire Eric Benson for the full time laborer position, seconded by Trustee Cole. All ayes.

New Business:

Overhead door at Village Shop Building- Waiting on figures for next month.

Utility Pole Outside Village Shop- Wanting to relocate pole on east end of the building. Trustee Cole made a motion to accept the bid from Elmore Electric for \$8,447.00, seconded by Trustee Kunkel. All ayes on a roll call vote.

Creek Maintenance- a tree near Cordums in the creek needs to be cut up and removed.

West Park Mural- Mayor Acker showed some ideas of a mural to be painted on the west park bathroom outside wall. He's been in contact with the Art teacher in Princeton, Liana Stites, and possibly her students. Trustee Funderberg made a motion to fund \$3,000.00 for this, seconded by Trustee Kunkle. All ayes on a roll call vote.

There being no further business Trustee Funderberg made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Trustee Cole.
